



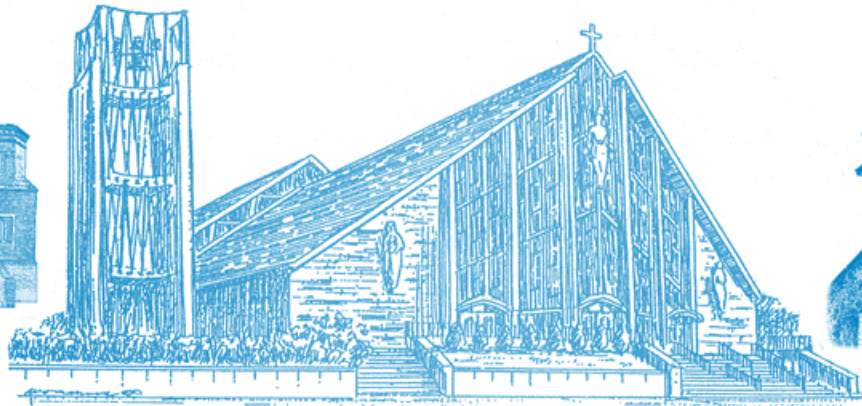

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

Fifth Sunday in Easter 2016-C

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Focusing on today's readings, it may come as a surprise to realize that at the Last Supper Jesus gave the command to *love one another*, and not soon after Judas left the Upper Room to go on his mission of betrayal. What the apostles witnessed were the new order which our Savior had come to bring, as well as the sign with which the world would recognize His followers. Jesus paid a great price to love us. It meant His crucifixion and death on the cross at Calvary. If we are to live by this new commandment, it means we, too, must undergo many trials in life because this love makes as many demands upon us as it did upon Jesus Himself. We need to learn how to go about loving others for the sake of God because, as we come closer to the end of our lives, we will be judged on how well we loved and treated others.



Our Lord's rule for living life properly may not present problems as far as loving our friends is concerned because most of us are fairly good at overlooking their faults as well as making allowances for their shortcoming and forgiving their failures. It's very easy to love those who are kind and loving to us but love calls us to do more than this. Nobody must be excluded from our loving. And, we ask, what about our enemies, those who do us harm and maybe still do? We must realize that we fail miserably when we retaliate and our good intentions are shattered as we gossip maliciously about them. Making us real Christians is the work of a lifetime. Conversion does not take place overnight and requires much patience.

The one thing we all need to experience is the kind of love that Jesus lived and preached. It's a love which finds its source in God. It's a fragment of eternity within our being and without which our lives have no meaning. This is the one commandment of which we are called to base every action and it is the very core of the Gospel. Love has the power to give meaning to impossible situations, to bring light into darkness, to inspire people as well as to fill them with hope and give them the courage to continue on the road ahead. The Lord may not be walking on our pathway today in His physical body but in every generation He continues the work of making the whole creation new through His disciples. The real good news is that we have been chosen to be instruments of His grace as well as the channels through which others may experience His love. It may simply be a smile, which costs nothing, because it comes from the heart. When you think about it, the only failure facing any Christian in life is the failure to love.

Today's Gospel is truly an invitation to look into our hearts and see how we are answering this call in our lives and within our families. But there is always a danger that we may be in love with ourselves rather than with one another. The presence of God so easily fades into the background when we give way to this inner selfishness. The real test of love is how we respect others. The real message today is that ***no-one can be a friend of Jesus Christ who does not love his neighbor and show that COMPASSION and MERCY to which we are called.***

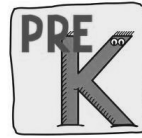
