BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

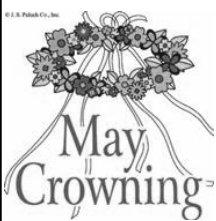

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

All of us occasionally experience those heartbreaking moments caused by saying good-bye. Today we have Jesus gently breaking the news of His departure to His disciples. The thought of His going away must have been so painful that their minds were almost numbed at what He was saying to them. For His disciples, the thought of Him not being there would be bleak and without meaning because the whole focus and direction of their lives was gone. And, yet, Jesus does not abandon them because, as His parting gift, He left the offer of peace which the world cannot give. This deeper peace of walking with God is difficult for the unspiritual mind to understand. This gift was not a promise to preserve them from hardships and suffering but, rather, a pledge to bring them safely through all the trouble to eternal life. The peace which Jesus was offering was the confidence of being loved as well as the assurance of knowing that God can be relied and trusted upon in those difficult and challenging times of life. It flows easily into our lives when we open our Hearts and allow God's Healing presence to work within us. His strength is a powerful Help to ease the tension and restlessness of life's difficulties which afflict our minds and soul. This peace which Jesus makes available is not easily won as it comes from striving consciously to live according to the will of God. Peace means the absence of war, a lack of noise, the avoidance of conflicts, an hour without pain and suffering. It was not the peace neither announced by the angels at the birth of Jesus nor willed at His death. The peace that is proclaimed is achieved by the victory over sin due to the power of God, and Jesus spoke of it on the night before He died. To obtain this peace means shutting out of our lives all that is selfish and greedy, all hatred and bitterness, and putting in their place forgiveness and mercy and the desire to help others and share with them the good things in life. The basis of peace is love which comes from the love of God and expresses itself in our love for people.

The question we have to ask ourselves is whether we are at peace with ourselves, which is the wonderful effect of being accepted by God. If His Spirit dwells within us, we can accept others in His name. Excluding others from our company means we are erecting walls to prevent God's love and peace from reaching us.



Today we celebrate the gift of peace which the Holy Eucharist gives us, especially as our children make their First Holy Communion at the noon Mass today. Please pray for them as they celebrate this special day in their lives and in the life of the Church. We will also be honoring Our Blessed Mother with the May Crowning. The Crowning of Our Lady usually place on Monday evening, however, due to the work being done in Church I decided to honor Our Lady and First Communicants together at the same Mass. Many thanks for your patience during this time in which work is being done in Church.

FAITH ON FILM EVANGLIZATION SERIES



In the desire to find additional ways to bring our faith to the public square, Fr. James Starasinich, the pastor of Sacred Heart Church in Lyndhurst, is continuing a *Faith on Film Evangelization Series*. The series shows films with faith themes in public cinemas. The hope is that in addition to encouraging and strengthening the faith of those who have a relationship with Jesus Christ, the films will also build a sense of community among all those who come to see them. The films are being shown in the public theaters in the hopes that those who are a little weaker in faith and may feel less comfortable going to a parish to watch a film, may feel more comfortable in a cinema. Additionally, if cinema managers begin to see that faith based films do indeed draw large crowds, perhaps they will become open to giving these types of films a greater showing. In this small way we can begin to cultivate a culture that respects and celebrates the gift of faith while also providing films that edify instead of offend viewing audiences.

The next film that will be shown in the series is *The Original Image of Divine Mercy - A Documentary*. Despite the popularity of the devotion to the Divine Mercy around the world, very few realize that there is only one Original Image of Divine Mercy. This new documentary released just in time for Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Divine Mercy tells the untold story of the unknown masterpiece and how it survived the violently anti-Catholic Soviet occupation of Vilnius Lithuania. The film also explores how many other renderings of St. Faustina's vision became so well-known around the world while the original image remains in obscurity. 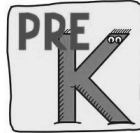
