**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDNTING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

Dear Parishioners:

"I am the living bread that comes down from heaven," says the Lord; "whoever eats this bread will live forever." These words are sung as the Gospel Acclamation for today, the feast of the Body and Blood of the Lord (Corpus Christi).

As we reflect on the gift of the Eucharist today in the celebration of this feast, in our being drawn more deeply into the Eucharist at each Mass and in our solemn procession today, we witness to the power of these words and their affect on our lives. As Catholics we see the Eucharist not merely as a symbol but as a reality. Although the bread and wine remain the same in *appearance*, they are transformed in our Eucharistic Prayer, particularly, in the priest repeating the words of consecration spoken by Jesus in the Gospel passage of today:

**"Take it; this is my body."**

**"This is the blood of the Covenant which will be shed for many."**

This transformation is called Transubstantiation: the *appearances* remain the same but the very *substance* of the bread and wine is changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. That Body and Blood has the power to transform us: to make us more sacrificial and unconditional in love, to enable us to live in closer communion with each other, to be an abiding presence of Jesus as He was in the midst of our world and, most importantly, to be food for our journey of faith.



As we process today with the Eucharist, we give witness to all these aspects of the Eucharist and the gift of the Eucharist enables us to give *witness* to the values of the Gospel. I will call your attention to Father John's article on what the American bishops have urged all parishes to do in defense of religious freedom in a time of prayer and reflection entitled, "Fortnight for Freedom," which begins June 21st, the eve of the feast which honors the martyrs St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More and extends to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

As you know, there is a tremendous attack on religious liberty; not only in various parts of the world, but here in the United States as well. Among the various examples that could be mentioned are the Health & Human Services (HHS) mandate for contraception, sterilization, and abortion-inducing drugs. Recently, the Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a document, "Our First, Most Cherished Liberty: A Statement on Religious Liberty." It is quite excellent. The Bishops encourage us to observe a "Fortnight of Freedom." The two weeks from the Vigil of the Feast of Sts. John Fisher and Thomas More to Independence Day [21 June – 4 July] is a particular time in which we can focus "all the energies the Catholic community can muster" to defend this first freedom. In the first place, it is a call to prayer. We will be offering various opportunities for that here in the parish, as well as some ideas about what can be done more privately. For now, you may find out more at the website for this sponsored by the Bishops; [www.fortnight4freedom.org](http://www.fortnight4freedom.org). By the way, Sts. John Fisher and Thomas More are the saints imprisoned by King Henry VIII because they objected to the government's attempt to take over the Catholic Church. St. John Fisher was made a cardinal while in prison. St. Thomas More was recently named patron of politicians. Both were martyred. St. John Fisher, St. Thomas More, pray for us!

PS – there is mention on page 6 of this bulletin about the movie "For Greater Glory." This film also addresses attacks of religious liberty as experienced during Christero revolution in Mexico. The movie has received lots of support from various groups, including the Knights of Columbus. There are martyr saints from this time (the 20th century!) some of whom were themselves Knights.

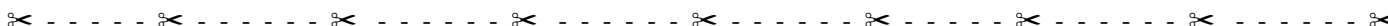

### YOUTH GROUP NEWS

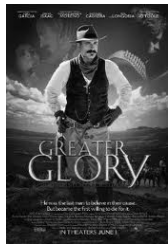

### FOR GREATER GLORY

#### What Price Would You Pay for Religious Freedom?



An epic new film, *For Greater Glory*, premiered in theaters across the country on Friday, June 1st. *For Greater Glory* tells the story of Mexico's battle for religious liberty and the Catholic Faith that rocked North America in the 1920s.

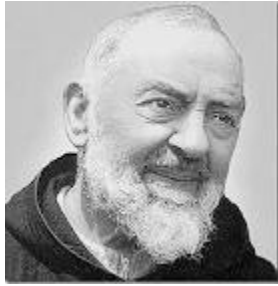
