**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

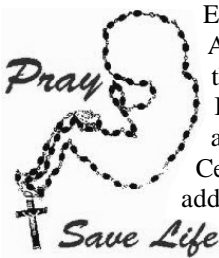
those with basic music knowledge to develop and advance their musical skills.

Members range from teens to seniors, some experienced singers; for others, this is their first experience singing with a choir. Some members read music while others learn by rote. Some singers have solo voices while others only perform with the group. All, however, have a common love for music, especially sacred music, and a desire to share their gifts with the parish. Singers and instrumentalists are welcome to give it a try.

**Time Commitment:** The parish choir usually meets on Mondays, 7-9 pm, from mid-October through Christmas, and then February through mid-June. The choir attends the 12:00 Noon Mass and performs most holidays and feasts.

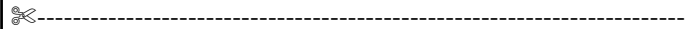


**NOMINATION FOR**
