BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

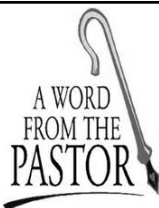

Dear Parishioners:

Many parishes have *carnivals*- - we have a *feast*. The colorful arches, the sounds of a feast band, the processions and devotions to Our Lady, all signify that what we celebrate is something *more* than just a carnival. The food, rides and games add to the festivities but, at the heart of our feast is the devotion to Maria SS. Addolorata of Castelpetroso, in the Molise region of Central Italy, and her three apparitions on March 22, April 1 and September 26, in 1888. She appeared in silence pointing to the body of her beloved Son, a Pieta different from the most popular Pieta created by Michelangelo.

The sadness and pleading in her eyes calls us to a simplicity and childlike faith that Jesus speaks of in today's Gospel. It speaks also of the rejection that her Son experienced and the rejection that all His followers will experience if they take His message seriously. Most of all, it speaks to us of courage - - the courage of Our Lady in the face of adversity and the courage we are challenged to embrace, a courage to live and accept life with its challenges i a joy-filled spirit - - that's what our feast celebrates.

I am grateful to the Societa Oriundi Castellani for preserving this devotion and, in a special way, to Gina and Alex Tamburri of our parish and all other devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata, for their dedication to this devotion.

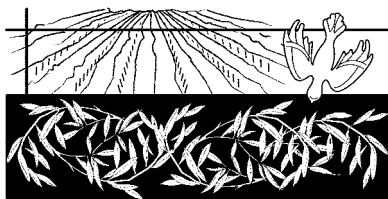

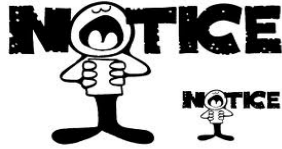

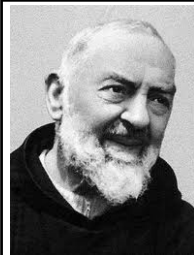

**MISSION CO-OP APPEAL—SEPTEMBER 29-30**

Twice a year, each parish is asked to take a collection to support the missions. In October of each year, we celebrate Propagation of the Faith Sunday and a world-wide collection is taken in every Catholic parish to support missions throughout the world. Also throughout the year, each parish is asked to allow a missionary to preach about a specific mission.

Next weekend, Fr. Paul Leon Varuvel, the Mission Coordinator for the diocese of Kottar in Southern India, will preach at all our Masses and a second collection will be taken for the missions of the Kottar diocese. We ask you to be as generous as your means allow.

Though small in territory, the diocese of Kottar is densely populated. There are about two million people in an area of just 645 square miles. Catholics constitute about 20% of the population. Fishing and farming are the main traditional occupations of the Catholic community there.

Your help and prayers for the success of the mission work of the diocese of Kottar is needed. Their most urgent needs are:

- Evangelization—deepening the faith and spreading the Gospel
- Training catechists and other leaders among the Laity for Gospel work
- Fostering vocations to the priesthood and the religious life
- Constructing/repairing small functional mission buildings to be used as places of worship
- Improving the socio-economic condition of the poor
- Promoting dialogue and understanding among Christians, Hindus and Muslims
- Establishing and strengthening small Faith Sharing Communities.

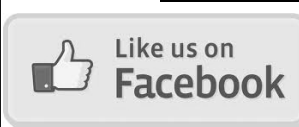
STAND AND BE COUNTED: NEW MEMBERS WELCOME

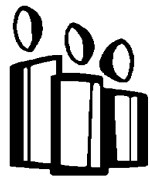

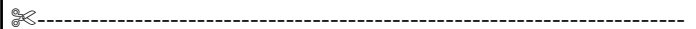
