BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

Dear Parishioners:

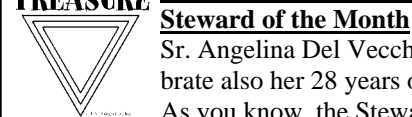
In Jesus' encounter with the rich young man in today's Gospel reading, we sense a certain discontent on the part of the young man who, apparently, has everything that life can offer yet is still restless and looking for more. When Jesus senses the good will and the genuine concern and seeming sincerity of the young man before Him, He offers him more. The "more" that He offers will require a "letting go" a sacrifice in order to find what he is looking for. Sadly, the rich young man walks away. This story is *our* story and the ending is either that which the rich young man experienced or another that involves risk and "letting go" of our illusions in order to embrace God's plan which will bring us happiness.

There is a great deal of restlessness in our post-modern world. We have everything; every technological "toy" we can imagine, hundreds of TV channels (remember when we were limited to 13?), an incredible array of opportunities, yet we seem to be "on overload," "stressed out," devoid of happiness, restless and crying out for real meaning in our lives. What do we need to "sell," to "sacrifice," to "change," in order to find true happiness which is what *eternal life* is all about; not the "eternal life" that begins at death but the "eternal life" that starts when we accept Jesus' vision of the Kingdom.

Today, a number of young people and some adults will receive Confirmation. Let us pray that the grace of God will enable them to seek as the young man did and to find what they seek.

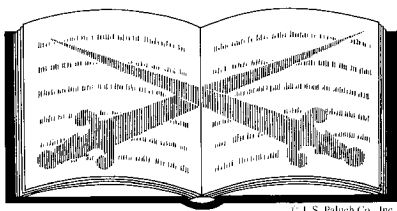

Interview with Sister Angelina Del Vecchio, MPF

Sister Angelina was born at home on Pine Street in Montclair to Angelina and Vito Del Vecchio. She was the youngest of nine children. She had five brothers and three sisters. The family owned and operated a neighborhood grocery store, and they hoped their youngest would finish school and enter into their business. When she announced to them, at age 11, that she wished to enter into the convent, their initial reaction was disappointment. They soon realized their strong love of the Lord was passed on to their daughter and there was no denying she was touched by the Holy Spirit.

Sister Angelina attended public school from K-9th grade. After school she attended a choir program where she met two women who touched her life and influenced her vocation. They were Sister Margaret and the late Sister Elizabeth. They taught her songs and further enhanced the faith which was instilled in her from childhood.

Sister entered the convent in 1943 when she was a sophomore in high school, to the Religious Teachers Filippini at Villa Walsh in Morristown. She received a BA from Saint Elizabeth College and an MA from Seton Hall University. Her professional career spans several decades of teaching nearly every grade, giving of her time and talent as teacher and principal. In 1978, Sister Angelina's career shifted. She became the Director of Religious Education in Warren, NJ, and then moved here to Holy Family in 1984 where she continues her service to our community.

Sister chose a life of Stewardship. She is an example to everyone, showing us how we should serve the Lord with the talents He has given us. She discovered early in life that she wanted to help others in the classroom, in Church, and through the various ministries to which she belongs. 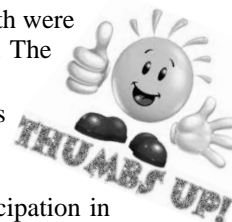

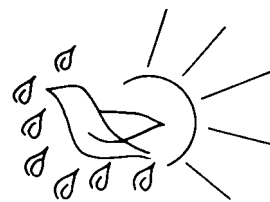

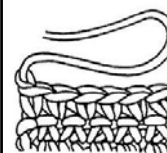

Recruiting Music Ministers "Praise God Through Song"



Function: Parish choir members play a vital role in the liturgical experience of the parish; in the beauty of song, prayerfulness of leadership, and the spirit of service to the community. The parish choir offers opportunities for those with basic music knowledge to develop and advance their musical skills.

Structure: Choir rehearsals include vocal training, rehearsal of parts, and time for fellowship. Choir members welcome newcomers and support each other, not only in singing, but in their personal lives, as well.

Member Profile: All members and friends of Holy Family with musical gifts are invited to participate. Members range from teens to seniors, some experienced singers; for others, this is their first experience singing with a choir. Some members read music while others learn by rote. Some singers have solo voices while others only perform with the group. All, however, have a common love for music, especially sacred music, and a desire to share their gifts with the parish. Singers and instrumentalists are welcome to give it a try.

Time Commitment: The parish choir usually meets on Mondays, 7-9 pm, from mid-October through Christmas, and then February through mid-June. The choir attends the 12:00 Noon Mass and performs most holidays and feasts.

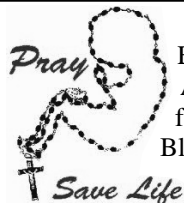

STAND AND BE COUNTED: NEW MEMBERS WELCOME

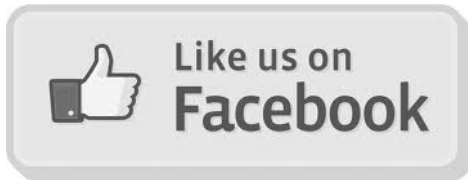
Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and a commitment to the life of the parish family. To so clearly state your Catholic commitment in all its dimensions brings you advantages, recognition, and responsibilities of many kinds.

Being a registered parishioner makes things much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor, and even funerals.

We are often asked to provide affidavits for baptismal and confirmation sponsors. We can only do this if a person is a registered, active, and contributing member in our parish. How do you know if you are already registered? A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. Most recently, a newly revised census form was sent with the summer newsletter and upcoming raffles. 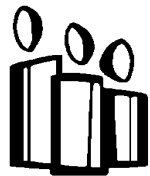

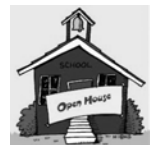
