



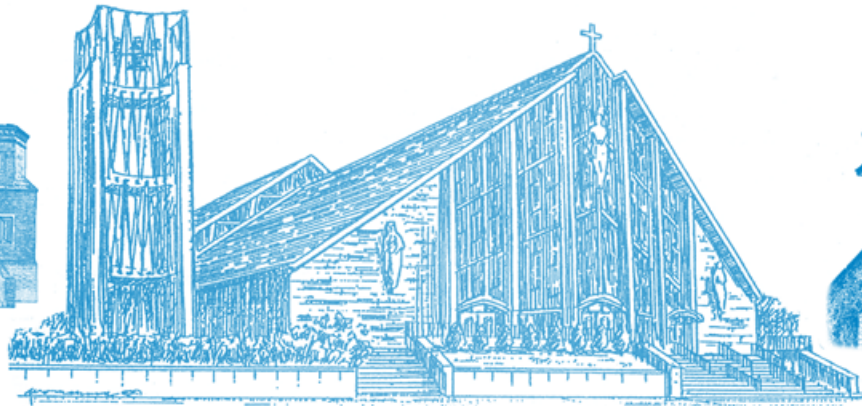

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDNTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us through the beeper, 973-715-3108. The priest on duty will return your call.

**Word from
Our Pastor**

Dear Parishioners:

In many ways, the Archbishop's pastoral on marriage, When Two Become One has set the tone for today's readings which speak to us of marriage and its sacredness. The Word of God and the Church's reflection on that Word throughout the ages are the very basic components for the formation of our conscience. For the Christian, conscience is not merely a whim or "a response to a passing trend," but a decision one comes to after serious reflection on what is revealed by God and how it applies to life. Conscience formation begins not with circumstances or prevailing opinions but with revealed truth. The revealed truth is the basic dignity of every individual from conception to natural death. The revealed truth is an adherence to the natural law, not only proclaimed by religious belief, but written into nature. Relativism has had a way of denying absolute truth of the dignity of the human person. On one hand, people will defend the exploitation of animals (which they should) but be in favor of abortion; they will support gay marriage and pre-marital and extra-marital sex as rights while vilifying and ostracizing those who disagree as bigoted, homophobic and narrow-minded. Again, the Church upholds the dignity of every human person but not every human action.

Today is Right to Life Sunday; it is not just a Sunday to proclaim that we are anti-abortion but that we are **pro-life**. In terms of human dignity being respected when it comes to life in the womb, poverty, hunger, homelessness and its roots, the dignity of the human person, regardless of race, sexual orientation or religion. Human dignity calls us to question violence, the death penalty, euthanasia and all forms of discrimination, and to uphold the dignity of marriage as God's plan has revealed it.



OPENING OF THE YEAR OF FAITH: OCTOBER 11, 2012

Recruiting Music Ministers "Praise God Through Song"



Function: Parish choir members play a vital role in the liturgical experience of the parish; in the beauty of song, prayerfulness of leadership, and the spirit of service to the community. The parish choir offers opportunities for those with basic music knowledge to develop and advance their musical skills.


Structure: Choir rehearsals include vocal training, rehearsal of parts, and time for fellowship. Choir members welcome newcomers and support each other, not only in singing, but in their personal lives, as well.

Member Profile: All members and friends of Holy Family with musical gifts are invited to participate. Members range from teens to seniors, some experienced singers; for others, this is their first experience singing with a choir. Some members read music while others learn by rote. Some singers have solo voices while others only perform with the group. All, however, have a common love for music, especially sacred music, and a desire to share their gifts with the parish. Singers and instrumentalists are welcome to give it a try.

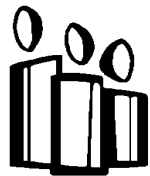

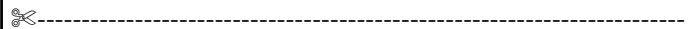
