MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDNTING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us through the beeper, 973-715-3108. The priest on duty will return your call.

Welcome to Our Parish



Dear Parishioners:

On Friday evening at the Mamre meeting (a support group and fellowship for married couples), the topic was, "Great Expectations and Realities of Marriage." Today, a number of couples whose marriages range from 10 to 60 years, stand before the altar and renew their vows to each other. I am certain that their witness to the "Great Expectations and Realities of Marriage" would provide an eloquent testimony, not only to other married couples but to those preparing to commit themselves to each other in marriage. Today is World Marriage Day, a good time for us to reflect on the value of marriage as both an institution and a sacramental sign of the presence of Christ in this world. So many challenges threaten marriage and family life today: attempts to redefine the institution of marriage, the divorce rate (one out of two marriages end in divorce), the reality of cohabitation (10% of all engaged and unmarried couples in the 1960's to 60% in our own age), changing mores and expectations, changing and challenging realities of living out a commitment in a post-modern age adds not only stress but leads to a great deal of confusion.

In today's Gospel, we see both reality and expectations at work. The Apostles, expert fishermen, have labored all night and caught nothing. Accepting the reality, they come ashore and Jesus tells them to "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." They are so caught up in the reality of their frustration that they, somewhat begrudgingly do so and, because they listen to Christ, whose expectations exceed their frustrations, they catch more fish than they can handle and "were astonished." When Peter asks forgiveness, Jesus replies, "Don't be so afraid, from now on you will be catching men." If Jesus is at the center of a marriage as the renewal of vows and the efforts of Mamre seem to indicate, then reality can be exceeded by the grace-filled expectations of Christ who meets us in the reality of our day-to-day struggles and continually inspires us to new insights and expectations.

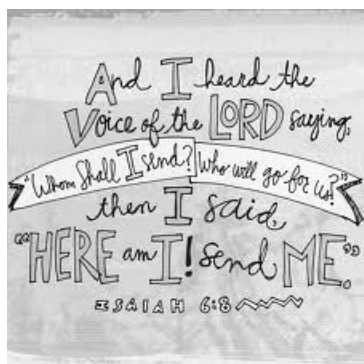
STEWARDSHIP CORNER

Interview with Michael Ramos

"When Hurricane Sandy first hit, it didn't bother me at first. I had grown up in Toms River but moved away after college. Even though I had a lot of childhood memories of *the shore* and still knew people there, some family and friends, I never thought about going or moving back there. I was talking to a friend who still lived down the shore and he mentioned the need for help. He said, 'It's not me that needs it; it's a lot of other people. If you have anything extra in your pantry, that would really help.' When I was finally able to get down the shore, I saw the devastation. So many people down there were hit bad. I was thinking, I only lost electricity for 2 hours here in Nutley but the families down there lost their homes. I saw a lot my childhood memories physically gone and that's when it finally hit me that I had to do something."

And Michael Ramos did. When he returned home he began sending e-mails and, by that weekend, his entire living room was filled with supplies: medicine, food, first aid, etc., so much so, that he was able to bring it down to the shore to help the victims of Hurricane Sandy. That went on for a couple weeks until he put out an appeal in the Church bulletin and the community of Holy Family responded, and not only responded but responded in a big way. Mike's cause to help the victims of Hurricane Sandy allowed our community at Holy Family Church to express its charity and Stewardship beyond the borders of Nutley.

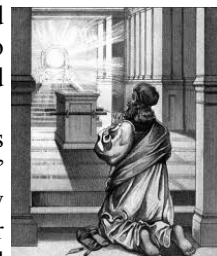

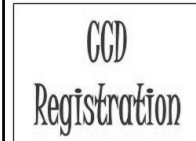

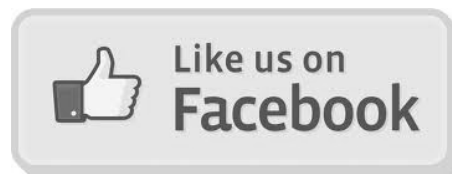

Mike Ramos is also a new Catholic. He was baptized Methodist when he was born but became a Catholic just last year. Mike shares, "My wife and her family were devout Catholics so I was around Catholicism. I first started going to a Catholic Church because of my wife. I went so I could be with her after we met. I was just going through the motions at first but, eventually, it all started to make sense and I found that it worked for me. I also decided to become a Catholic because of my children. My wife and I wanted our children to be raised Catholics. When we had children, my sense of right and wrong suddenly became incredibly important. I had a conscience before but, when my children were born, my conscience really took hold. When I found God, I found conscience. I found right and wrong clearly with God. Once I realized this I made the decision to go through the RCIA program and to receive the sacraments."

Mike is the oldest of 3 children. When he was young it fell to him to take care of his younger brother and sister. His sense of responsibility made Mike grow up faster than the other kids his age so that he can take care of his family. The challenges and struggles to take care of his family helped Mike develop leadership qualities that carried beyond his family into other areas of his life. He was captain of his high school football team, president of the Peer Leadership Group in school and a squad leader in the Army Reserve. Mike shares, "I wanted to be the best person I can be so I turned to God for that. I've always been a doer, a giver, even when I was kid. I am an outgoing person. I like to be involved. So this carried over into my church life when I became a Catholic. Now that I am at Holy Family I want to be involved there as well and lead by example. The parish website was a good start. It was a good fit because of my background in graphic design and technology."

Mike is also a member of the Knights of Columbus. "Everything the Knights do is charitable work," Mike shares, "Charity under God." "What first struck me with them was their 'Bottles for Moms' campaigns. That was a big hit in my home. I realized that if an organization like the K of C does things like this, it was an organization of which I want to be a part. I also love the monthly adoration with the Knights of Columbus on the First Friday of every month. I get to spend an hour listening to God talk to me. I look forward to that each month. I remember when I first went to Adoration, Steve Picciano Jr. asked me if had I ever been to Adoration. I told him, "No, it's my first time." His reply to me was, "Then all you need to do is just listen." "That was important for me to hear."

"I am honored to be selected Steward of the Month and how the Stewardship Council sees me as a servant of God. I had thought of myself as just helping out. I never equated what I was doing as serving God. Now I see that what I do is more than just helping out. It is serving God and doing charitable works. I now understand that I *am* serving. I find "being a servant of God" a very gratifying term, that I can make a difference and hope that God can be proud of me."

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2013 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
3. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially,” or as a whole, is a serious obligation. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 17, 2013, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 26, 2013

***Canon 920, §1:** All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year

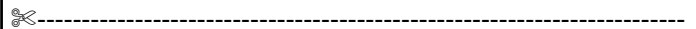


**NOMINATION FOR
