MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

Dear Parishioners:



From The Pastor's Pen

As we enter into this Holy Season of Lent, we accompany Jesus into the desert to confront the challenges and temptations of life as He did. In the Lucan account of the three temptations, we recognize the account of Matthew with one juxtaposition. Matthew records the third temptation as the one in which Jesus is asked to "bow down and worship Satan and receive as a reward, he power over all the kingdoms of the world." St. Luke makes that the second temptation.

In the three temptations, we are invited to take a look at ourselves and how we are subtly tempted, as Jesus was, to seek material things or "quick fix answers" as the solutions to our problems (the temptation to turn stones into bread). In the second temptation, we are confronted with our tendency toward compromise, self-seeking attitudes, looking for the "easy way out," (bowing before Satan and receiving a temporary reward). In the third temptation, we are challenged to look at how a show of power, an uncontrolled ego, a desire to impress, not to serve, can easily control our lives ("If you are the Son of God, throw yourself off the temple...").

Each temptation that Jesus faced reveals something of our struggle and temptations and, in this response to the devil in each instance, we find our own responses.

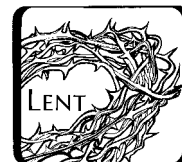

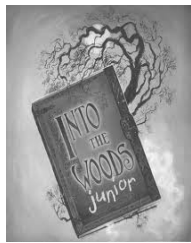

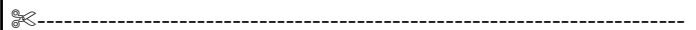
