MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

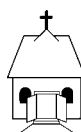

Dear Parishioners:

The sudden announcement of Pope Benedict XVI's resignation from the Papacy has left all of us with a wide range of emotions from shock to confusion to a certain insecurity, as we look toward a new pope and try to fathom the reason for our Holy Father's decision to resign.

This has led to all sorts of speculation about his health, etc. Perhaps the better term would be *retirement*. At 85, the Holy Father, recognizing the burden of his office in an honest, prayer-filled and carefully considered move, decided to choose an option that has not occurred in 600 years and, at several other points in the history of the Petrine Office, the desire to retire or resign for the good of the Church. I, for one, can very much understand his decision. He is a man of great faith and intellect and, since his election to the Papacy eight years ago, has demonstrated a great pastoral heart but, if his own recognition that he could not continue to serve as effectively as he once did, we must respect his decision and pray for him. I believe in the power of the Holy Spirit to give us the Pope we need for each moment in history.

In the past century, we have had men who embraced the challenges of their own time and circumstances: Pope Benedict XV, in the wake of WWI; Pope Pius XI in the fragile post-war period of diplomacy while Fascism and Nazism were on the rise; Pope Pius XII, who proved to be a powerful spiritual leader in both his encyclicals, his moral strength during WWII and a great defender of the Jewish people. Through his effort, thousands of Jews were saved.

This world was then taken by surprise by our beloved, now Blessed, John XXIII, who revolutionized the Church and the world with Vatican II and his own warmth and embrace of all in the *aggiornamento*. Then came Pope Paul VI, "The Pope in the Tempest," who suffered greatly in keeping the Church together despite divisions, within and without, who was followed by John Paul I, whose short reign helped to transform the papacy by his gentleness, his smile and his simplification of the Papal **installation**. From 1978 until 2005, Pope, now Blessed, John Paul II, gave us an outstanding witness on so many levels as the traveling Pope and the Pope of the Young (World Youth Day). The Pope who made dramatic advances in the new evangelization and the embrace of all humanity among many other accomplishments. In these past eight years, Pope Benedict XVI has built on the work his predecessors, with his gift of intellect, his outreach to the alienated, and his ability to build and interpret during this Year of Faith, a renewed understanding of the Second Vatican Council.

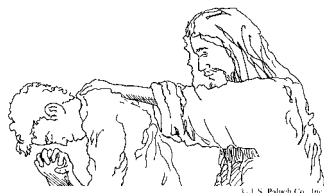
Let us trust the Holy Spirit to inspire the Cardinals in conclave to chose someone who will bring his own unique gifts to meet the unique challenges of the Church and world he will serve during his Pontificate.

Today, the Second Sunday of Lent, is traditionally the Sunday when the Gospel of the Transfiguration is proclaimed. It is a Gospel of hope and transformation, a sense of vision given to our first pope and two other apostles so that in difficult and challenging times, they would not lose hope and would see every circumstance as another opportunity for transformation.

Let us pray that our Holy Father's decision to retire, and the election of his successor, may be seen in this light.

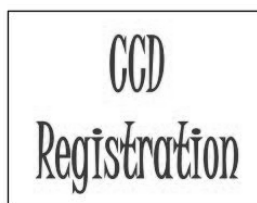
