**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

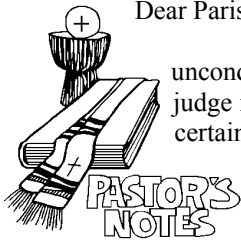

Dear Parishioners:



Today's Gospel passage reveals again, as did last week's story of the Prodigal Son, the infinite mercy and unconditional love of God. It also points out the self-righteous attitude of so many who seek first to condemn and judge rather than to look at their own faults and shortcomings. It exposes their lack of compassion for others. Jesus certainly demonstrates compassion and love for the sinner. He doesn't condemn the person, only the sin. This should be both a consoling and challenging message for all of us. It is so important to know how deeply the Lord loves us, even when we sin, and how He challenges us when we lack compassion and understanding toward others. So often, we condemn others when we fail to embrace our own faults or feel as if we are beyond hope in terms of God loving us, even in those actions and sins that we feel render us unlovable.

This story of the woman caught in adultery should be both a consolation and a challenge to all of us.

Today at the 10:00 A.M. Mass, our three elect and one candidate for the Easter Sacraments will celebrate the third and final Scrutiny as they prepare for Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist. They reflect on the Gospel of the Raising of Lazarus from the Dead and are challenged to recognize how sin has deprived them of a new life in Christ. Pray for them as they continue their journey.
