BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

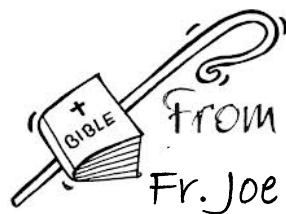

Welcome to Our Parish



2nd Sunday After Christmas 2013—The Epiphany of the Lord
My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

We live in a world where beauty, as well as ugliness, is found. We do not always agree on what is beautiful or what is ugly. We know that some people have very strange tastes in beauty, still at least they find some things beautiful. Even a little knickknack they might insist upon showing us may seem hideous, but at least we can see in their faces something of the beauty which they can see. The fact is, that is where beauty lies. It is in them, the way they light up, when they hold up the item they think to be so beautiful; maybe they are right.

As Christians, we are to look for beauty in the world, especially because of the words we hear in today's Gospel: "through Him all things came to be," there is a beauty in everything, a beauty that even seems to incorporate the ugly things in life to a greater beauty. To see that beauty and to live as part of that beauty is not enough for us to simply gaze upon these things. There is one who gazes on all things and that is God. "God saw all the things that He made, and indeed it was good." We cannot see the world through God's eyes, not yet, but the Son of God has become incarnate to enable us to see the unity of creation in Him. As God the Father sees the creation that He has made through His Son, so we, who are part of creation, try to see the Father through the Son.

We need to truly realize that the humanity of Jesus is the most beautiful thing there is. There is a beauty that takes away from other beautiful things, making them seem insignificant by comparison, but the beauty of our Lord Jesus is not like that. The beauty of Christ is called *light* by St. John because it is light that reveals not just itself but other things. We cannot see the light except through the things that light illuminates. Jesus is the Savior, the Redeemer, the Christ of Israel, the Lord. These are the titles that speak of His being for other people. When we look at the crucifixion of Jesus, we come realize that it was an attempt to reduce His beauty, to drag it down to the ugly notions of those who had embraced darkness. As Christians, we know that this failed because through His Resurrection He drew out of the hideous nature of the crucifixion a greater beauty, a beauty that darkness could never comprehend.

Each of us is called to share in that beauty, to be holy and spotless in Christ, as St. Paul tells us in today's second reading. There is a famous saying of Blessed Teresa of Calcutta (which I quote frequently), and it became the title of her biography: "Something Beautiful for God." We should always remember that each of us has been given special talents from our God the Father and so: "What you can do, I cannot, what I can do you cannot, **BUT TOGETHER WE CAN DO SOMETHING BEAUTIFUL FOR GOD.**"

It is by grace and mercy that we can become something beautiful for God, something beautiful for Christ. To show mercy or care for someone is a kindness but, if we do it out of a sense of reverence as a child of God, then it is more than a mercy or kindness, it is an act of worship. As we journey through this Christmas Season, let us spend a little time at the crib of Jesus. The little statue of the Christ Child will help us to understand the unity of all things, their beauty and their worth, because through that little Child all things came into being.

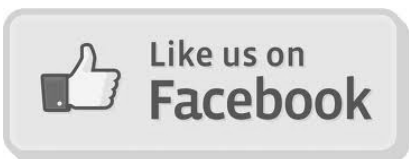

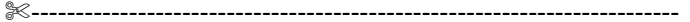

Newark Museum Day Trip Wednesday January 29, 2014 - Depart 11:00am & Return Approximately 4:30pm - Cost \$35 Per Person Includes Bus, Admission, 2 Guided Tours & Box Lunch

The Newark Museum is a little gem right here in Essex County with an extensive permanent collection of visual art and artifacts, and connected to the Ballantine House – the preserved Victorian Era home built by Scottish immigrants who founded the Ballantine Brewery in Newark. Our day will begin at 11:30am with a tour of the Ballantine House, then a break for lunch in the Museum's beautiful atrium at 12:30, followed by a tour of the North Wing's highlights, after which you may explore on your own until we depart at 4pm. This trip is limited to 28 people, so book early if you want to get a spot.
