



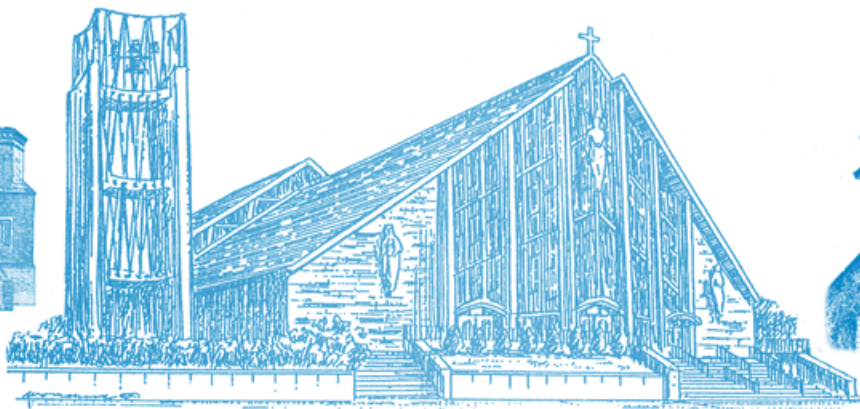

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-715-3108. The priest on duty will return your call.

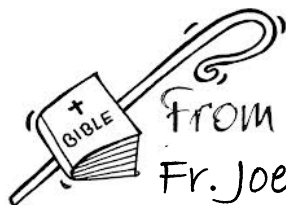

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

It is very evident, in today's Gospel, of how Jesus is aware of the many ways in which we all go around believing ourselves free and in charge of our lives when, in fact, we are very trapped. We can think that earning more money will free us and that our buying power and future choices will be increased. Our lives in today's world can be quickly defined by our making money, fulfilling material ambitions and providing for ourselves and for our families, not only what is needed but also, as much as possible. We believe that this is where happiness lies. And while ambition and earning a good living may not in themselves be bad things, they can become our *masters*. And what Jesus warns us is that when this happens, when all our energies and time are given to these masters, we are then drawn away from God.

The great tragedy is if we allow ourselves to be drawn away from serving God. In fact, living as a "slave of God" or as "Christ's servants," is not about having our freedom restricted or about being enslaved at all. To commit ourselves to living under God's mastery is actually to live our lives in a radical trust and that is how we come to know a great happiness and freedom. Sometimes we fail to realize that the Lord is not only *Master* but is even more, a loving parent who provides for his children and who never forgets His people. The call that Jesus makes today, that is, *not to worry*, is a call above all else to a relationship of trusting love in His Father and ours. God's great desire for us is that we should be free from anxieties so that we may be free for joy, love and service, as well as the rest needed.

We all have things we have to do each day, to earn a living, to care for others in our families and, in truth, we all at some time or another have things in our lives that we properly worry about. But God, who knows the deepest parts of our hearts, truly knows the realities of our lives. And despite what some might think, even the lives of priests and religious are not free from such ordinary and practical responsibilities. But we do live in a world which is so often dominated by material ambition and anxiety. But our Lord, through the gift of our faith, reaches out to us with the promise of freedom, peace, and the time, space and energy to get to know Him better, as well as to love and care for one another.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank everyone for the kindnesses shown to Monsignor Paul this past week. One of the most difficult parts of a priest's life is when we are called to move on from places where we have found our comfort zones as well as from the community which we have come to know and love. Please continue to pray not only Monsignor Paul, but for all priests and religious who move on to new assignments. It is a challenge for all concerned as we go through the journey of life.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2014 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially,” or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
3. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 9, 2014, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, June 15, 2014.

***Canon 920, §1.**

All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year

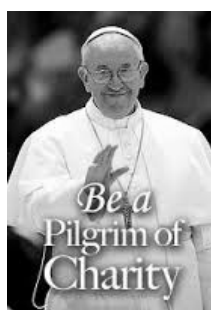

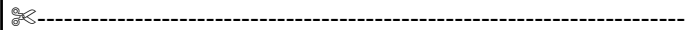


**NOMINATION FOR
