



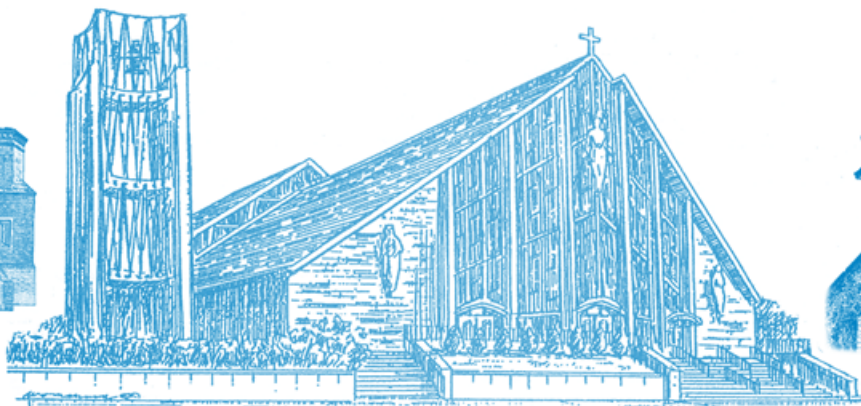

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**From the
Pastor**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord;

Today we hear about the tears of Jesus; we might ask ourselves what do the tears of Jesus tell us about Him? First off, by Our Lord shedding those tears for His friend Lazarus, we learn that Jesus was fully human. In taking human nature to Himself, the second person to the Trinity took all of our human nature, body and soul. Jesus is fully human and He has all the emotions that we have - - like sorrow, anger and joy. In fact, because He was not effected by the tragedy of original sin, He is more fully human than the rest of us. All of His emotions are fully integrated with His reason; often, ours can only get out of control. For example, we can be angry for the wrong reason, at the wrong person, to an unreasonable degree, and all at the same time.

When you think about it, what makes the tears of Jesus particularly striking is that they were not simply an emotional reaction. There was nothing superficial about them. Because His emotions are perfectly integrated with his reason, and his reason is undamaged by original sin, Jesus always sees the very causes of all sin and suffering in the world. One of those causes is, as scripture tells us, the work of the devil; in the words of the Book of Wisdom, "it was the devil's envy that brought death into the world." Tears by themselves do not raise the dead. But because Jesus is also fully divine, He was, and is, able to not merely return life to the corpse but truly resurrect us all.

As we journey through life, our part is to respond and nourish a life of grace and to make the Holy Spirit welcome in our hearts and minds. Our free response to the grace of God is, at the same time, a result of that grace. And truly our human response. By living a sacramental life in the church, we are nourished by the sacraments and prayer and good works. But we can do more to appreciate what God is doing with us. As we reflect on all of this, perhaps we could adopt a favorite prayer to the Holy Spirit, to remind us of His gracious dwelling within us. When we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us more fully, even our own tears can become part of God's gracious gift of salvation.

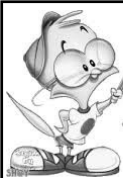

THE PASCHAL CANDLE



The Paschal Candle represents Christ, the Light of the World. The pure beeswax, of which the candle is made, represents the sinless Christ who was formed in the womb of His Mother. The wick signifies His humanity, the flame, His Divine Nature, both soul and body. Five grains of incense inserted into the candle in the form of a cross recall the aromatic spices with which His Sacred Body was prepared for the tomb, and of the five wounds in His hands, feet, and side.

During the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night, the priest or deacon carries the candle in procession into the dark church. A new fire, symbolizing our eternal life in Christ, is kindled - which lights the candle. The candle, representing Christ Himself, is blessed by the priest who then inscribes in it a cross, the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, (Alpha and Omega 'the beginning and the end') and the current year, then affixes the five grains of incense.

The Easter candle is lighted each day during Mass throughout the Paschal season until Ascension Thursday. The 2014 Paschal Candles, one in the Church and one in the Mother Cabrini Chapel, have been donated in loving memory of

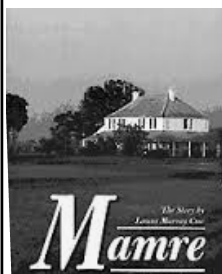

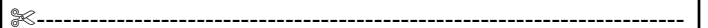

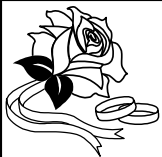
