Interview with the June Steward of the Month

Emaline Palumbo

Speaking with Emaline Palumbo is like taking a trip through time. It was a wonderful opportunity to speak with someone who has lived through not only the history we learned in school but also the rich history of Holy Family Parish.

Emaline's Stewardship began as a member of the Rosary Altar Society, a ministry she has been involved in for most of her life. She first became a member of Rosary Altar Society when she was only 11 years old. At that time, girls attended meetings with their mothers. Emaline's mother would bring her along to the Rosary Altar Society meeting and functions. The youngsters were known as the "Children of Mary."

At 94 years young, she still drives (been driving for over 42 years and counting) to come to Holy Family and continues to energetically devote her time with the Rosary Altar Society and the Holy Family Annual Feast. She has been giving her time at the Holy Family Annual Feast, or the "Calendar Party" as it was known in the days of Monsignor DiLuca. To this day, Emaline helps with the Feast in the kitchen where, whether it is cleaning the vegetables or pots and pans, she puts so much of her love and energy to help make it a success.

Emaline used to assist making Palm Crosses at a time when they were fashioned by hand here at the parish. She would also help to sort the palms for distribution on Palm Sunday so everyone would have nice palms for the masses and their homes.

Emaline and her family have been part of Holy Family for many years. Emaline was born on January 11, 1920, to Italian immigrants. Her parents were from Avellino and Naples, Italy. She is the 7th of 10 children in her family that consists of 3 brothers and 7 sisters. The entire family was always very close, very religious and devoted to God. Emaline tells of her father's sister who was a nun at St. Anthony's Orphanage in Italy. One of her brothers, Anthony Nigro, who was Steward of the Month for July 2010, has stayed close to Emaline and, to this day, lives next door to her.

Emaline grew up during the Great Depression and was the only member of her family to have graduated from high school. Her father worked nights at Public Service, now known as NJ Transit, to support their family so his children could be educated. Emaline went to Lincoln School, Nutley Junior High School and Nutley High School (class of 1938). After graduating, she and all the kids of that age were working to help support the family during the Depression. All the money they made, they gave to their mother.

Trinity Sunday 2014 A

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Trying to explain the complexities of the theology of the Trinity will always be beyond the human mind in this life. There is a famous story about St. Augustine, but there no record that Augustine actually told it and it is known only from the thirteenth century. It seems that the story takes place with Augustine, sitting on a beach and trying to grasp the mystery of the Trinity, when he sees a young boy with a seashell collecting water from the sea and pouring it into a hole in the sand, then returning to get more water from the sea to add to the hole in the sand. St. Augustine, being distracted by this, asked him, "What are you doing?" The child answered, "I'm going to pour the entire ocean into this hole." St Augustine responded, "That is impossible, the whole ocean will not fit in the hole you have made." The boy then replied, "And you cannot fit the Trinity into your tiny brain."

Yes, trying to explain the Trinity is beyond our imagination, but it not a concern for us today because we gather to celebrate the most Holy Trinity and not to understand it. Our entire liturgy for this day is wrapped up in the Trinity. Our prayer is addressed to God the Father and Jesus Christ His Son, both who live and reign in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God in three persons. It would be interesting to sift through all the liturgical texts for almost any occasion and examine just exactly how many times the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are mentioned - - from the time we begin, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," to the blessing which invokes the protection of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, at the conclusion of the Mass.

The fullest and most remarkable revelation of God comes from Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, who alone has come from heaven. It is Jesus who tells us of God's purpose and plan for our world, and it follows from God's own revelation in the Exodus of the God of tenderness and compassion, and is affirmed by Paul's statement that Jesus is graceful, God is full of love and that, in the Spirit alone, we can have true and genuine fellowship. Jesus tells us what God wants for the world. It is not condemnation, because God sent His Son into the world so that the world could be saved; that is, *that you and I could be saved!* Jesus is God's plan for the world in action; He is truly the love of God, God's graciousness and the foundation of human fellowship in the Spirit.

Today is a special day in the life of our Parish as I am installed as the tenth pastor of Holy Family. I am so grateful to have members of my family present, as well as many friends, and knowing there is so much so much love and support. I am grateful for my brother priests, especially Fr. John and Fr. Mauro, for their continued support and friendship as well as the Religious Teachers Filippini, who have nurtured me from my time in grammar school. The Franciscan Sisters of St. Elizabeth as well as Sr. Eileen have, through the years, become an important part of my life. It is a special blessing and privilege to have Bishop Donato here today at the beginning of this special journey. It will be a challenging journey for all of us.

Each one of us is called to look around and search for the Lord who is always in our midst, most especially in those situations when we feel that we are alone. Our Lord does come through people and places we least expect. As a community of faith, we must realize that the responsibility we bear is to let the divine light within us shine through others. May God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit bless us through this special journey, which we share together as the parish family of Holy Family.

Her family first came to Holy Family when it was located on Harrison Street. Emaline received all her sacraments at Holy Family and tells of a time, in our history of Holy Family, when children were able to receive their First Holy Communion in the morning and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation at night from Monsignor DiLuca. What a time!

As part of the history lesson, Emaline reminisces of how Monsignor DiLuca used to come by their home, as he did with most of the parishioners of Holy Family, to visit the family and beg for money for the parish that he loved so much.

Emaline was married in 1942 by Fr. Francis Blake. At that time, Holy Family Church had just been built in 1938; it is now our Parish Center. Her stewardship blossomed even more so after she was married. Along with her membership in the Rosary Society and volunteering at the various bazaars and festivals, Emaline has been attending First Fridays devotions and the Monday evening Miraculous Medal Novena since 1942. Emaline is now a member of Sassy Seniors at Holy Family. (Another interesting fact is that since the 1940's, Emaline has been a Yankee fan from the post-war era of the Golden Age of the Yankees to now. How fortunate is that!)

Stewardship to her is living her life as a Catholic. She just wants to puts her energy to good use and being active in the church.

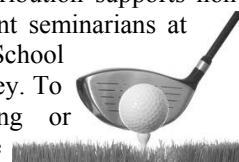
