BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

20th Sunday in Ordinary Time...A-2014



My brothers and sisters in the Lord;
The message in today's Gospel speaks of the divisions that exist between culture and religion. We see how the Canaanite woman crosses the boundaries which separate the Holy Land from the lands of the Gentiles. In addition, despite not being Jewish, she is only one of two people in the Gospel of St. Matthew that our Lord commends for their faith.

It is also interesting that the Canaanite woman publically acknowledges Jesus' identity even before the disciples have done so. It seems that she has accepted Jesus' mission to Israel first but she believes, too, that Jesus serves others as well. It is here that Jesus responds to such a profound faith. This woman is able to tear down the dividing wall of intolerance between the Jews and Gentiles and our Lord rewards her for this. The belief that God's blessings are limited to people of certain nationalities or cultures has been around for a very long time. Such a belief was present and alive in the society in which Jesus grew up. Every people and culture has a handful of such prejudices and myths. These include the myth that only one particular race or nation can possibly be loved by God to that of no salvation, outside the Catholic Church or from the myth of superiority of men over women, to that of the superiority of the Western Cultures. We are invited today to expose such myths and correct their false and exaggerated claims.

The first thing we are taught by the Canaanite woman in our Christian vocation to reconcile all humankind to God, is courage. Her refusal to take no for an answer finally paid off and we may remember this in our work for the common good. We can have the courage not to be afraid to challenge the prejudice which surrounds us. If we allow God to enter our lives, He can then use us to bring justice and healing to all of God's disadvantaged sons and daughters in the world.

The second thing we can learn from this woman is the power of persuasion and dialogue. When Jesus spoke to her in language that was demeaning to her people, she did not retaliate in anger but rather, she kept her eyes focused on the goal of her mission which was to show that even non-Jews were entitled to God's blessings in Jesus. Her gentle response forces Jesus to rethink His response to her request. This woman is truly a model of non-violence. Jesus gave in to her saying, "Woman you have a great faith. Let your wish be granted." The message is clear for all us and that is to be persistent in our prayer and never give up. Keep knocking and the door will be open, maybe not in ways we would like, but only according to His will for us.

As we continue vacation time, please don't forget the Lord and attend Mass while you are away. Be mindful also to "catch up" on offerings for our parish. As you may know, Fr. Mauro is in Italy visiting his family as well as going on retreat. This coming week, Fr. John will also be taking some time. Please keep our priests in your daily prayers.

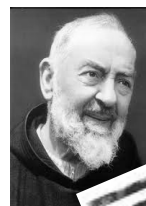
