



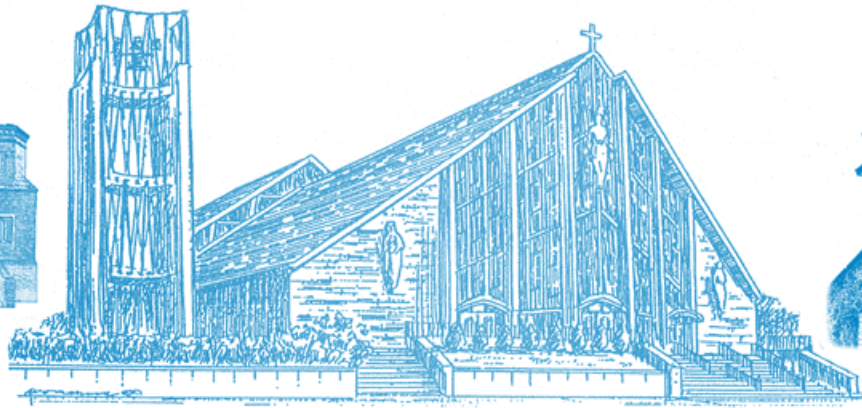

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Last Sunday, we learned from the Gospel that Jesus was proud and happy that Simon Peter had recognized Him as, “the Son of the Living God.” He proclaimed to Simon Peter, “You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church.” Today’s Gospel, however, is not so good concerning poor Peter. Jesus calls him “Satan.” And all Peter is trying to do is console Jesus and give Him his support. But Jesus has reached the point of His relationship with His disciples that

He wants to share with them what the future will bring, namely, what is going to happen. He tells them that He must go to Jerusalem and suffer and die. He also makes it very clear that He will rise again on the third day. The disciples, however, don’t seem to be focused on the rising from the dead but, rather, on the suffering and dying and this is where Peter says to Jesus: “Heaven forbid, this must not happen to you.”

Today’s Gospel passage comes only five verses after last week’s Gospel. The words: “Get behind me, Satan,” are strong changes of tone, so quickly. It seems as though Jesus says one thing in one breath and then something different in the next breath. We have the strength of Peter put before us, in one breath, in the words, “You are Peter,” and then, suddenly, we have his weakness in the “Get behind me Satan,” in the next breath.

Peter has many wonderful qualities and we are happy in them. However, the Scriptures make sure that we are aware of Peter’s failings, too. For example, when Peter is walking on the water, he panics and cries out for help and, ultimately, Peter tells Jesus that he will die for Him but then he denies Him and runs away. Peter is a real person, of flesh and blood, full of bravery as well as the fears involved in discipleship. His is an example that we do well to follow. We see that when Peter fails and makes mistakes, he never gives into despair but, rather, comes back time and time again to Jesus, even though that means taking up his cross on a daily basis.

When you think about it, are we not like Peter in his humanness and unworthiness? Could Jesus say the same to us, “Get behind me, Satan”? Probably many of us, if not all of us, can think of moments in our lives when Jesus could say that us. But let us always remember the things that we have done or the person we have been that would make Jesus proud of us.

One of the reasons we come to Church is to help make us better followers of Jesus. Yet there are times when we can be so conscious of our sinfulness and failure that we are left feeling helpless on the road to holiness. As we pray at Mass together today, let us focus on what the Lord is telling us in today’s Gospel. He is clearly saying that if we truly want to be His followers, we have to pick up our crosses and follow Him every day. We are not offered an easy road and there are times when we are tempted to go in a different direction. The challenge is that, in reality, we know what Jesus calls us to do but the question is, do we have determination to do it? And when we fail, do we have the faith to turn to Jesus again?

My brothers and sisters, vacation time has come to an end for many; if you are traveling this Labor Day weekend, please be safe. Let us remember, in prayer, all teachers and students. Please be careful of children and adults who are on their way to and from school, most especially, in our parish parking lot as repairs continue. We thank you for your continued patience and understanding as we continue this renovation and make our parking lot safe for all. Our next phase will be the church steps, as soon as the necessary permits are released.

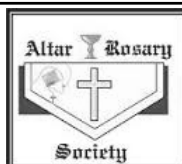
