**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

**23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 2014-A**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Wherever people get together, whether it is a family gathering, a football game, a visit to a university or even a church, there will be, from time to time, almost inevitably some disagreements, misunderstandings, or some type of “falling out.” Differences of opinion or viewpoints can lead to brooding and bitterness and when it comes to countries around the world, it could lead to armed conflict. But, on the other hand, it could result in some type of healing or, perhaps, some helpful discussions in the airing of those grievances.

Today’s readings focus on who best to address or settle problems which arise in the local church, in particular, on the issue of brotherly or sisterly correction. This is clearly a delicate and, often times, a thankless task. Yet we know there are times when it has to be done. Ezekiel, in our first reading, insists that just as a sentry is duty-bound to warn of approaching danger, so he, the prophet, must warn those who persist in wickedness, of the consequences of their actions.

The second reading puts things into perspective: St. Paul teaches us that “love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbor.” Christian correction only makes sense when it is done in the spirit of love. To *correct with love* means that we do not simply set out to win an argument; we do not descend to sarcasm; we are deeply conscious of our own weaknesses as well as sinfulness; we do what we are called to do and are aware that the Lord knows what is in our hearts and He can change them.

Loving others may be relatively easy when it is a matter of being generous and compassionate towards them. But there is another deeper and more costly love. There may be those times when we are called to practice the love that cares enough to confront, to challenge and even to oppose. Genuine love refuses to collude with wrong-doing through silence, although there are situations where wisdom dictates that silence, for the time being, is the best policy.

Whenever we have the courage to oppose what is evil, we are involved in the Church’s task of binding and loosing. That is, binding the evil forces that oppress people and loosing the bonds that prevent them from living the fullness of the life in God’s kingdom. As Christians, we are called and challenged to love enough to speak uncomfortable truths at times, but always in humility and love. The final words of today’s Gospel apply not only to communal prayer but also to every honest attempt to restore peace and harmony within the community. Jesus promises: “Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, I shall be there with them.”

It is hard to believe that another Labor Day has passed. My prayer is that everyone is well-rested as a new academic year begins for both teachers and students. We pray for all entering new schools for the first time, especially nursery schools and colleges, as well as those returning from their travels. We welcome Fr. Mauro back home from visiting his family these last weeks. Deacon Anton also has returned from the Philippine’s.

**UPDATE ON PARISH REPAIRS AND RESTORATION**

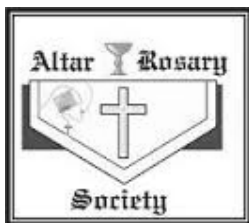
I am happy to say that the paving and striping of the parking lot is now complete and it looks beautiful. The next stage of restoration is the church steps. We are awaiting the scope of work, needed to be completed by an architect, in order for the proper permits to be approved by the Township of Nutley. The rectory is near completion; we are awaiting approval from the town engineering department for some of the ceilings to be closed. Many have been asking if I have moved in to the rectory. Actually, I have been here since the end of April in one of the completed guest rooms. My rooms have stored the furniture and personal belongings of Fr. John and Fr. Mauro while their rooms were being renovated. My own furniture arrived last week from storage and I still have odds and ends at St. Anthony’s, as well as in storage. I am still sorting through boxes but, yes, I do live here at Holy Family. The worst is over and we just keep moving forward.

**Upcoming work:**

Once the front steps of the church are complete, there is more work to be done in the Church: addressing leaks, inoperable doors, leaders and gutters, electrical and other odds and ends. The Parish Center also needs work: repairs to a leaking ceiling, painting, and proper drainage for the entrance deck to the Chapel. Next we will address the St. Joseph Center’s leaking roof; we just replaced the St. Joseph Center furnace. All the buildings on our property need to be addressed and the basic overall maintenance of each structure must be followed through. Little by little, we are getting there. Once again, I can’t stress it enough, many thanks for your patience.

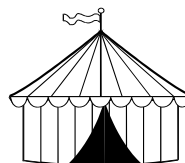
