27th Sunday in Ordinary Time – A 2014

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

At some point or other in life we have all heard the expression or have been told, “If you don’t use it, you lose it.” This can range from our language skills or our muscle tone to musical skills as well as sports skills. The concept of *brain training* has been popular to help us avoid dementia or other ailments. There is, of course, some truth to this saying. In order to develop our bodies and minds, we know we need to use them. In order to learn a skill, we need to practice it repeatedly (*practice*

makes perfect), to really integrate that skill into our life.

In the ancient world, the Greeks thought this applied to moral virtues as well. To them, people could be taught to be virtuous. By exercising the virtues they became part of the person. They developed the theory of the cardinal virtues which include prudence, temperance, fortitude and justice. Training in the virtues was arduous and if you didn’t use them, you lost them. They could not be turned off and on like a faucet. They had to become part of your character.

The same can be said for all of our talents and skills that if we don’t nurture them, they can wither and die. We may even lose the idea that the virtues or our own talents are important at all. On a supernatural level as well, if we don’t use the virtues of faith, hope and charity, we can lose them. As we practice the virtues they become a part of who we are. With regard to the virtue of faith we can say, “Lord, I believe, help my unbelief.” As the virtue of faith comes to the aid of our intellect, we could, perhaps, match it with what St. Paul says in the second reading, “Fill your minds with everything that is true.” We could also match the virtue of hope with St. Paul’s advice; to ask God for things “with prayer and thanksgiving,” since prayer is the expression of both memory and hope. We could match our charity with his counsel to “keep doing all the things that you learnt from me.” The virtue of charity comes to the aid of our will, so that we can and will work for that which God has prepared for us. If we use these virtues, then we won’t lose these virtues.

This is not always easy. Bad habits, temptations and weariness all interfere with our attempts to be faithful servants and good stewards of the gifts which God has given us. But we must remember that Jesus is always at hand, in prayer and in the sacraments, to come to our aid and raise us when we fall. Upon entering this month of October, let us remember that Our Lady, the refuge of sinners and the help of Christians, prays for us continually so that when “the heir” comes, we will be ready to receive Him joyfully.

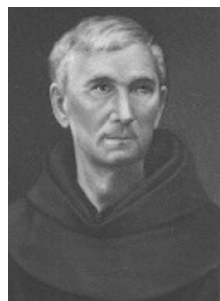

Our Mass was wonderfully attended; it always wonderful to see the church filled.

I share with you some news about my installation as a Knight in the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. I was truly humbled by the whole experience and am grateful to our Archbishop Myers for nominating me and, most especially, our Holy Father for approving the nomination.
