**BAPTISM:** Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

**EMERGENCY CALLS:** In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-715-3108. The priest on duty will return your call.

# FROM THE PASTOR

## Our Lord, Christ the King 2014 – A



My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we celebrate Christ as our King. The reading of the day invites us to reflect on the kind of king Christ is and what it means for us to say that we belong to His kingdom. In the first reading from Ezekiel, it suggests that human leaders have proved unwilling to govern God's principles, and so the Lord Himself will come to lead us. This promise is fulfilled in the person of our Lord Jesus Christ, who used His authority to serve and assist others. God's idea of leadership is to tend to the needs of those who are vulnerable. We have a king who pays attention to us and helps us, not only when we are needy and disadvantaged but, especially when we are needy and disadvantaged. The specific actions which we hear in today's Gospel are to feed the hungry, to give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to shelter the homeless, to visit prisoners and to take care of the sick. We might ask ourselves, is Christ a king? The answer is yes, but not in the sense in which other kings are kings. Rather He is the only king who really does what we always, and deep down, hope for from every kind of leader. He rescues us from evil and restores our tranquility. St. Paul tells us that He rescues us from our deepest, darkest, and most threatening enemies, as well as from sin and death, and He brings us into a new place, into new relationships with God, with one another, and with the world.

We must always remember that God knows everything; He knows whether our hearts are compassionate like the sheep in the Gospel story or if we are pretending to be compassionate, like the goats in the story. God wants our hearts to be truly compassionate, particularly singling out the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick and the imprisoned. We might consider a ministry to support that which could involve any of these groups of people. Perhaps we could help at a local food bank. We could learn more about the root causes of thirst and hunger in the world, and ways in which environmental groups are trying to conserve our natural resources. We could support those groups who are working for peace trying to prevent wars.

Jesus is a king who constantly ministers to those in most need. As we pray this Mass together, let us reflect upon who truly rules the world, our lives and our hearts. All of us can do something in the service of our true king and of each other.

- Each year, some tags are taken but the gifts are not returned in time. Please help us so that no one has to be disappointed at Christmas by being left out. If you take a tag, return the gift by the deadline of December 14.
  - Gifts are often distributed at organizations' parties. We are asking for gifts to be returned by December 14 in order to arrange for them to be picked up and distributed before Christmas. If you wait too long to return your gift, it probably won't get to the person wishing for it. (If you're dropping a gift off on Christmas Eve, it's too late for this year.)
  - Some folks like to leave "extra" gifts under the tree, without a particular gift tag. We welcome these gifts but help us by identifying what's inside the box. Tell us if it's a toy or clothing, for a boy or girl, man or woman, size or age, and item. We hate to unwrap a pretty box just to confirm who should get the gift inside.
  - No need to put bows or ribbons on the gifts. Just attach the gift tag from the tree (or a description on your own tags) so we know where to best distribute the gift.
  - If you are answering a request for a gift card or stamps or some other small item, PLEASE box or bag the gift as envelopes can be too easily mislaid.
  - Spend only what your means allow, but no more than \$25 should be spent on any gift.
- Holy Family parishioners are always so generous and loving when it comes to the Giving Tree. Thank you for everything you do to make Christmas happy for others.

**Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse  
The Archdiocese Addresses Victims' Concerns**

The Archdiocese takes very seriously the needs of victims who approach the Church seeking healing from abuse. In addition to offering counseling and other support services, in appropriate cases, the Archdiocese provides reasonable compensation to those victims seeking a financial settlement of their civil claim, even after the statute of limitations has lapsed. Settlements are not confidential unless requested by the victim, and may include funding for continued psychological counseling.

The Archdiocese's general liability insurance coverage is the sole source of funds used to pay abuse settlements. Although the Archdiocese, parishes and schools pay premiums to purchase insurance, no parish or school assets, Archdiocesan assets or Annual Appeal or other fundraising collections are used to pay civil claims related to abuse cases.
