**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!



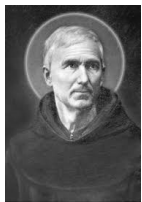
Today we celebrate the Feast of St. John Lateran and our eyes are turned to Rome and to the Cathedral Church of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope. In Rome, the Church of St. John Lateran is the Church that houses the local Christian Community and this feast celebrates that local place. But because the bishop of Rome is the head of the Church Universal, this feast is also, and equally, the feast of every local community throughout the world. Today is the feast of this local Christian Community which includes Holy Family Parish, Nutley, NJ.

St. Paul says that we are a building and each one of us is a living stone. As such, we give one another support by living beside one another and being there for one another. We provide a roof over-head and a shelter from the cold.

We give warmth to one another as well as welcome. In the sharing of the Body of our Lord Jesus, we give sustenance to one another. We belong to one another. We are a family in Christ Jesus. And most of all in his teaching, St. Paul tells us that the "temple of God is sacred." St. Paul is speaking, not about a building but about each and every human being. When you think about it, it truly is a wonderful grace to know and to see that every person in this world is sacred and is to be treated with the utmost reverence. One thing we must never forget is that the place in which God dwells is in a human heart, freed from corruption and prejudice, a heart which is open to welcome and receive all people of goodwill. When St. Paul preached about the Lord in his missionary journeys, he used this image of a building to describe the real "house of God," which is made up of people joined together in the Holy Spirit.

**BLESSED LUDOVICO OF CASORIA - Priest of the Franciscan Friars Minor  
Founder of the Franciscan Sisters of St. Elizabeth (1814 - 1885)**



Blessed Ludovico of Casoria (Archangelo Palmentieri) was born on March 11, 1814, in Casoria, Italy. He entered the Friars Minor in 1832, taking the name Ludovico. Shortly after his ordination, he was appointed to teach philosophy and mathematics to the young members of the Order at the Franciscan Friary of St. Peter in Naples.

In 1847 he had a mystical experience which he later described as a cleansing. He dedicated his life to the poor and the infirm, establishing a dispensary for the poor, schools for the African children, an institution for orphans, the deaf and the speechless, and other institutes for the blind and elderly. He once said, "The love of Christ wounded my heart." This love prompted him to great acts of charity.

To help continue these works, he established the Brothers of Charity and the Sisters of St. Elizabeth.

Ludovico wrote a spiritual testament which described faith as "light in the darkness, help in sickness, blessing in tribulations, and paradise in the crucifixion, and life amid death." He was beatified in 1993 by Pope John Paul II and will be canonized on November 23, 2014 in Vatican City by Pope Francis.
