



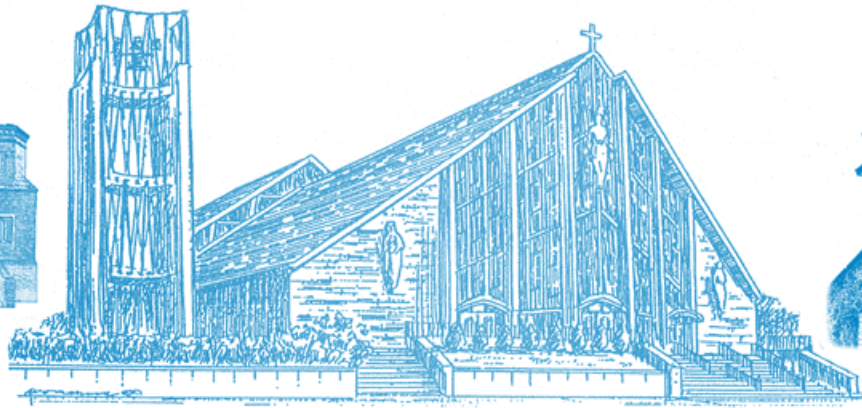

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

PASTOR'S MESSAGES



4th Sunday in Advent and Christmas Message 2014

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

We have arrived at the fourth week of Advent and the celebration of Christmas is only a few days away. In our modern world today, many people think of the Christmas story as another feel-good fairy tale. Such "happily ever after" stories are just for children, to help them go to sleep. The real world is much scarier, with real-life monsters committing real-time atrocities. And yet for those of us who still believe, behind the glitter and sparkle of the Christmas lights, there is the truth of God the Father who loves us so much that He sent His only Son, Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary. Jesus is the abiding sign of God's eternal love; that no matter how much we might experience human failure and disappointment, **GOD'S LOVE NEVER FAILS; GOD WILL NEVER TURN HIS BACK ON THE PROMISE TO COME TO US AND MAKE A HOME WITH US.**

Human journeying, whether physical, as in the trek to Bethlehem, or metaphorical, as in the rethinking done by Joseph and Mary, is only half of the story. The wonder of the Christmas story we reflect on is not the human journey but, rather, the divine journey. With the birth of Jesus, God enters the lives of humans precisely where they are. Although Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem, it is, in reality, God travelling with them in the gift of this unique child they are given. When the heavenly host appears to the shepherds, it happens exactly where the shepherds are at that particular moment, at work in the fields. What is even more remarkable is that shepherds, who are forbidden even to enter the synagogue or temple because they work with animals, are visited by God's messenger precisely when they are working with animals, which made them unclean.

It is here that we find the wonder of Christmas; it is about God who comes to our lives exactly where we are at any given time. It is about the birth of Emmanuel, a name used by Isaiah meaning, "God is with us." The birth of Jesus is about God who is never far from us, because God is always living among us. Christmas is about the closeness to us of the God who never leaves our side, even when we are not sure of where our own journey is leading. We must remember that on our own, we could never reach God. In the birth of Jesus, God reaches down to us.

My brothers and sisters, on behalf of Fr. John, Fr. Mauro, myself and the entire parish staff, we wish you a very Blessed Christmas Season filled with the wonder and awe of the special love our heavenly Father has for each one of us. May His abiding love and peace be with and your loved ones always.

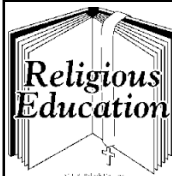

History of the Candy Cane

In the late 1800s, a candy maker in Indiana wanted to express the meaning of Christmas through a symbol made of candy. He came up with the idea of bending one of his white candy sticks into the shape of a cane and incorporating several symbols of Christ's love and sacrifice. First, he used a plain white peppermint stick. The color white symbolizes the purity and sinless nature of Jesus. Next, he added three small stripes to symbolize the pain inflicted upon Jesus before His death on the cross. He added a

bold stripe to represent the blood Jesus shed for humanity. When looked at with the crook on top, it looks like a shepherd's staff, because Jesus is the Shepherd of man. If you turn it upside down, it becomes the letter "J," symbolizing the first letter in the name "Jesus." The candy cane serves as a lasting reminder of what Christmas is really all about.

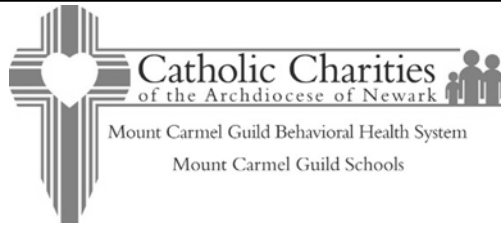

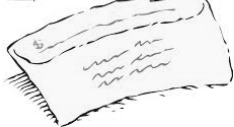


Have you noticed our Clothing Bin?
