



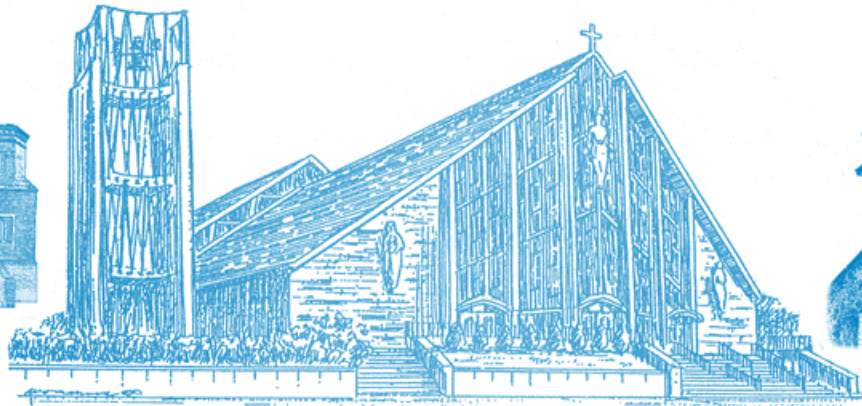

**BAPTISM:** Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The ways we are called and how we respond are unique to each of us. If we look at our last two popes and their first feelings about being called to the priesthood, we find quite different stories. Benedict XVI recalled playing, making altars and celebrating Mass with his brother at an early age. Pope Francis, coming from an equally devout family background, took a different route. It was not until he was in his late teens that a conversation with a trusted priest led him to consider the idea of a priestly vocation. In fact, this idea came at a time when he was considering proposing to his girlfriend. And, even then, the road was challenging. His father was pleased but his mother was concerned about the many demands that would be made upon him. Francis was taken gravely ill with a lung infection and underwent serious surgery. His first attempt at discerning a vocation to the priesthood was with the local diocese but he later discovered that his true home would be with the Jesuits. When you think about it, it is a complicated road, but then it could be reassuring to us as we try to sort out what God is asking of us in our lives. My own vocation was also challenging as I was very happy in my work and with my friends. I was basically settled; yet at the age of 33, a door was opening in a different direction. We plan, God laughs.

To discover our true calling and how to be a disciple, we are called to follow the same pattern described in St. John's account. We may not come from an appreciation of the Old Testament and the knowledge his disciples brought, but that does not matter. We bring ourselves, with whatever particular strengths or weaknesses we might have. We can know that we are invited to come to Jesus Himself and spend time with Him. This time may be spent with prayer, in learning about Him, in just giving time to be with Him. It is this gift of ourselves that will allow us to grow in our understanding of Him and also what He has in store for us.

We might not be the rock that Jesus called Simon Peter to be, but we will have a significant role to play. Our close acquaintance with Jesus, our living with Him, our allowing Him to touch our lives, is what will lead us into both understanding and action. If we find it difficult to believe that God has a special interest in us, we can also help each other discover our callings.

Pray for an increase in vocations and for all who have chosen to serve the Lord in this special way.

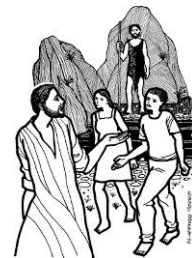

## JANUARY IS "POVERTY AWARENESS MONTH"

### Children in Poverty USA

In 2012, 21.8% of all children lived in Poverty USA—that's over 1 in every 5 children.

In 2012, the National Center on Family Homelessness analyzed state-level data and found that nationwide, 1.6 million children experience homelessness in a year.

Luckily, there are programs that help. The National School Lunch Program provides low- or no-cost meals to impoverished children. In 2012 alone, the program served subsidized lunches to more than 31.6 million children—and has served 224 billion lunches since its founding in 1946.

The Holy Family food pantry is in need of stocking up. Food donated must be **non-perishable**. After a recent inventory of the pantry, the following is what is needed:

**Breakfast Foods:** Pancake Mix, Syrup, Hot & Cold Cereals; **Condiments:** Sugar, Powdered Milk or Creamer (Parmalat, too!), Salt & Pepper, Bottled Herbs & Seasonings, Salad Dressings, Mustard, Ketchup/Mayo, Oil, Vinegar, Bread Crumbs, Olives, Pickles; **Canned Foods:** Fruits, Fish, Meat, Ham, Poultry, Juice, Crushed & Stewed Tomatoes - we have a lot of canned vegetables & soups; **Kids Favorites:** Peanut Butter, Jelly, Crackers (for the PB&J), Cookies, Snacks, Chips, Pretzels, Microwave Popcorn, Beverages, Juice Boxes. **Baking Supplies:** Flour, Icing, Pie Filling (we have a lot of cake mixes). We are also in need of Coffee (we have none!) & Tea; **Baby:** Baby formula, foods & diapers; **Legumes:** split pea, lentils, cannellini, kidney, etc., white & brown rice. We have enough pasta & macaroni for the time being. If you donate from your home pantry, please check that the items are not expired.
