RECONCILIATION: Saturday, 1:00 PM

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

From the Pastor

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

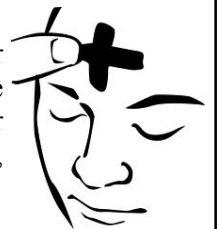
If you were to read the bible passages in the Book of Leviticus, you would read over 3,000 words which comment on leprosy. We heard from there in our first reading, telling us that the leper shall cry out, “unclean, unclean,” and dwell apart from the rest of society. After contracting leprosy, a person had to leave their family, friends, livelihood and way of life. In a sense, it was the end, or death, of the familiar bonds and intimacy. It was socially inappropriate for the leper mentioned in today’s Gospel to approach Jesus, let alone speak to Him. And yet, the leper makes his own desperate plea for healing and recognizes that Jesus does have the power to declare him clean. He says to Jesus, “If you want to, you can cure me.” And Jesus does indeed touch and cure him.

We see that both Jesus and the leper break the rules given in Leviticus by crossing the lines of ritual boundaries. Jesus had already broken a few boundaries; two of His healings were on the Sabbath day. The compassion of Jesus causes Him to do extraordinary things. Perhaps the only thing more startling than an “unclean” person intentionally approaching a “clean” person is for the “clean” person to respond by deliberately touching the “unclean” person. Ironically, through Jesus’ healing, the man who was once unclean can now enter society while Jesus, who is stainless, is forced to remain outside in deserted places, at least for the time being. Again, according to the laws of leprosy in Leviticus, anyone who comes into contact with an “unclean” person will become unclean themselves. Just as the leper has begun his journey back into society, Jesus is alienated from it. And yet people are still attracted to Him and look for Him.

When you think about it, to bring help to the outcasts, Jesus Himself has to become an outcast and, according to the Gospel, stay outside in places where no one lived. Like the leper, we are called to be faithful witnesses to God’s healing power not just with words but by actions, too. We follow Jesus every time we reach out and cross the boundaries to contact people and groups who are ostracized and in need of healing.

This week, we begin the Lenten journey with Ash Wednesday. Please check the bulletin for distribution of Blessed Ashes during this day. Our Chapel in the parish center is open daily for private prayer and devotion throughout the days of Lent. Please take some time before the Lord as we enter this special Season of Penance, almsgiving and prayer. Stations of the Cross begin this Friday, February 20th, 6:45 PM in English and 7:45 PM in Italian, in Church.

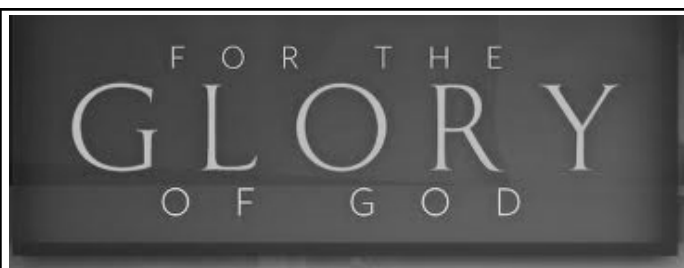

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2015 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially,” or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22, 2015, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 31, 2015.**

**Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

- First Friday, March 6, Exposition at 6:00 P.M. with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M. Morning Prayer & Benediction.
