3rd Sunday in Lent B -2015

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we focus on the gospel reading for today, we see that St. John places his account of Jesus cleansing the Temple at the beginning of the public life of Jesus, whereas the other gospel writers place it the end, closer and just before the passion of Jesus. When you look at this, the intentions of the gospel writers are very similar. It is seen as one of the final straws in Jesus' irritation of the authorities. An attack on the Temple practices would be seen as blasphemous by them and would lead to the pushing of the arrest of Jesus.



From The Pastor's Pen

Throughout his Gospel, John's concern is to portray Jesus replacing the great symbols of Israel's past with His own person. For the people, the Temple was the central symbol in their faith. This was the place that celebrated the very presence of God, originally in the form of the tablets of the Ten Commandments handed down to Moses as the expression of the Lord's covenant with His people. For John, this replacement of the Temple by the person of Jesus will lead ultimately to the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. John's goal is that he wants his readers to be aware of this transformation as they continue to read the rest of the Gospel. For John, timing of the event is significant. It happens just before the Passover, the occasion in which the freedom of the people from slavery is celebrated. Jesus, in His person, will be the freedom of those who follow Him; as St. Paul will point out, madness and foolishness to the Jews and the Greeks, but for those who follow Christ the very power and wisdom of God.

The point which Jesus wants to make is that the people had lost sight of the real meaning of the Temple. They treated it as a commercial thoroughfare; they no longer placed God's commandments at the center of their lives. As Jesus cleansed them of this abuse, He also pushed them to see Him as the new center of their relationship with God. It is through their allegiance to Him that they will be renewed and really cleansed.

As we continue in this journey of Lent, it is also a time that we are asked to reflect on our own preoccupations and allegiances. It is a time where we should be reflecting and asking ourselves, where is Jesus in our lives? Are we making time for Him or do we let our daily concerns and practices leave little time or space for Him in our lives. If Jesus is truly in the center of our lives, then the way we deal with the business of life will flow from that, and we will have a sense of peace as well as direction. If we work in the opposite direction, and put Christ second into our lives, then we will find ourselves lost and confused.

My brothers and sisters, as true brothers and sisters in the Lord, we should always remember that the core element of our Lenten journey is getting rid of whatever stops Jesus as being at the center of our lives and so uplifting us with the gift of His Spirit. And whether it is spring or autumn in our world, the need for new life remains the same. We hear and remember the words of Jesus in the Gospel, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

A New Understanding of Mourning

Each individual has a unique experience of grief that needs to be respected and supported rather than a series of steps or stages that must be endured. While mourning is a very private experience, it does not occur in a social vacuum. The bereaved needs the witness and engagement of others. Mourning is an active process, not a passive one. The bereaved need to find meaning in their loss and understand the impact of this significant death on their lives. The mourner balances the complicated tasks of "letting go" and "holding on" to the lost significant other. There is a gradual acceptance that the loss is real, yet there is often the need to maintain a sense of connection. Mourning often involves a lifelong process, rather than a time-limited period with a definite "closure" end point. While there is an acute period of mourning that is more circumscribed, the loss often continues to be revisited at crucial periods and integrated over a lifetime.
