



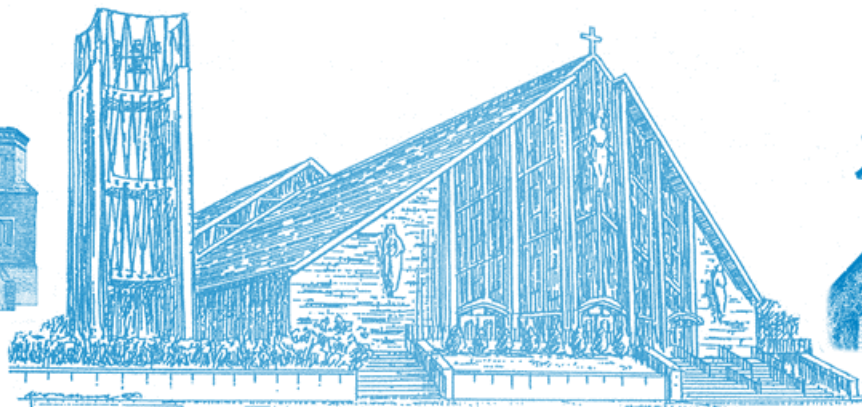

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

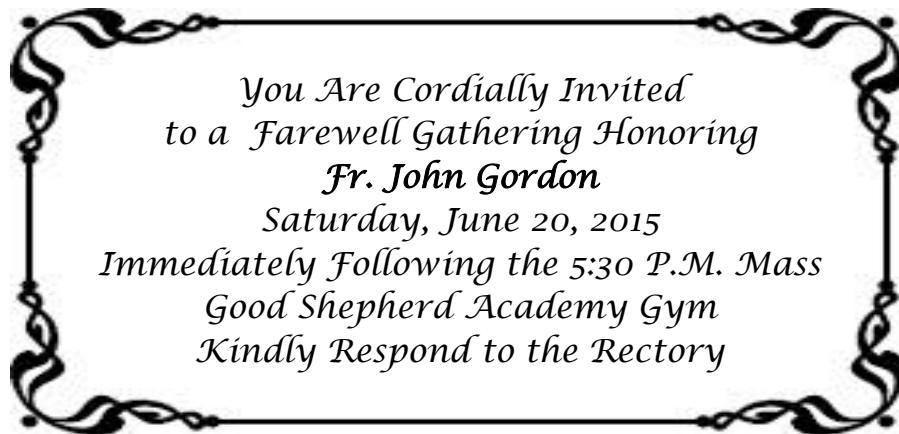
My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

This time of the year is special for many as it is the beginning of adventures. Vacation time begins and, as we travel by car through many parts of the country, we see the miracle of growth taking place all around us in flowers, trees, plants and shrubs. Words cannot capture the magnificence of the scene as the cycle of nature blossoms forth in all its beauty. The creation of God is around for us to enjoy. It is fascinating and sure that harvesting begins in many areas. We don't have to be professional gardeners to appreciate that growth is a gradual process. It has its origins in tiny seeds which, after being buried in the earth, demand time, tender care and patience for them to blossom and produce their fruit.

As we listen to today's readings, we realize they are concerned with growth, not physical growth but rather spiritual growth. They speak of the importance of us coming to God in prayer and good works in order to grow in God's favor and friendship. God is at work in every generation and in each of our lives. The seed of His Word was planted in our hearts at the moment of our baptism. Our task, as parents and godparents and family and friends, is to water and tenderly care for His Word so that it can work powerfully within us. As most of us were baptized as infants, it was our parents who had the vital role in nurturing the seed of God's Word in us. The example parents set by prayer and good Christian living in the home will go a long way in determining their children's attitude to life and to God.

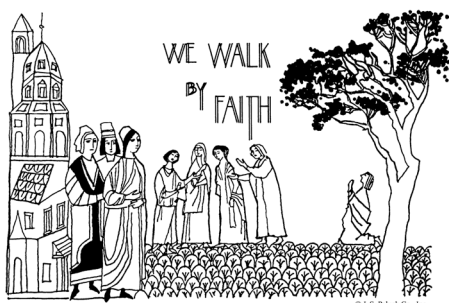
The story of the mustard tree reminds us of the important truth of Christian life: the seed of God's Word laid within us grows slowly and invisibly. We cannot rush the growth of the seed in the earth and neither can we rush God's growth in our hearts. There is nothing we can do to hurry it. We can tend to the seed of the Word of God that has been planted in our hearts by prayer and the sacraments which allow us to do good works and acts of loving kindness. It is in this way which we make ready the earth in which the seed of God's Word can blossom. There is no age at which we cannot grow in God's grace. We need to realize that life is but a passing shadow and the few years given to us here on earth are for soul-making, because if we do not grow in moral and spiritual stature while on earth, there will surely be lots of growing up to be done in purgatory.

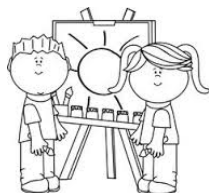

A New Understanding of Mourning



Each individual has a unique experience of grief that needs to be respected and supported rather than a series of steps or stages that must be endured. While mourning is a very private experience, it does not occur in a social vacuum. The bereaved needs the witness and engagement of others.

Mourning is an active process, not a passive one. The bereaved need to find meaning in their loss and understand the impact of this significant death on their lives. The mourner balances the complicated tasks of "letting go" and "holding on" to the lost significant other. There is a gradual acceptance that the loss is real, yet there is often the need to maintain a sense of connection. Mourning often involves a lifelong process, rather than a time-limited period with a definite "closure" end point. While there is an acute period of mourning that is more circumscribed, the loss often continues to be revisited at crucial periods and integrated over a lifetime.
