12th Sunday in Ordinary Time B-2015

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As I reflect on today's Gospel, I couldn't help but remember my very first cruise. It took place a few weeks before I entered the seminary; New York to the Bahamas. We had arrived at the Bahamas and we weren't on the beach for more than 30 minutes when we were told to get back on board the ship. I could see in the distance that the sky was getting very dark and the ocean quite choppy. It was evident that "a hurricane was a-coming." Once everyone was on board, we started sailing up the coast as Hurricane Gloria followed behind. It seemed that without warning, the sea suddenly changed from peaceful blue waters to angry waves. The power of the storm at sea was evident and it became a frightening ordeal as the winds picked up and the ship's pool seemed like washing machine swishing the water around fiercely. Being on a large ship, one could only imagine what it must have been like for the Apostles on a small boat being tossed around while they were sound asleep and without a worry concerning the danger. With angry shouts they awaken Him, thinking that Jesus had no concerns of the storm.

When you think about it, this story in today's Gospel has a modern ring to it. We can easily make a connection between the storm at sea and the trials and suffering of our own lives. Troubles, disappointments and misfortunes come our way from time to time and our faith is severely tested. Although we might not admit it, there are times when we may feel disappointed with God as these setbacks bring sadness and anxiety into our lives. For parents, it is hard for them to stand by and watch their children make a mess of their lives, especially when they have done their best to set the good example and bring them up according to good Christian values. The temptation is there to react angrily with God and wonder why He doesn't act and intervene and stop the heart break. These feelings are deeply human and very understandable and nothing to be ashamed of because our reaction is no different than those of the Apostles.

When we don't get an immediate response from God to our prayers, we lose heart, panic, and a frightening sense of "drowning beneath those waves of despair" comes over us. The reality is that we live in a stormy world and God does not give any ready answers to satisfy our human questioning. There are mysteries in nature, beyond our solving and suffering, and this is just one of them. Let us remember that God did not take away suffering and death even from His own Son. There can be no answer to these questions except one inspired by faith and faith is what we lack. Today's Gospel should be seen as one of hope because it shows us that Jesus is always near to us, hidden in the heart of suffering. It calls us to have faith and to take Jesus seriously because He alone can give us courage and inner peace which casts out the fear on the stormy voyage of life. We need to realize our heavenly Father is with us and we do have the power to dispel all the fears that come our way as long as we put our faith and trust in Him who loves us so much.

This week-end we bid farewell to Sr. Diana Yodris who has faithfully served as our Director of Religious Education for the last three years. We pray for her as she prepares to make her final vows as a Religious Teacher Filippini as well as beginning the challenges of her new assignment at St. Thomas Aquinas School in Rio Rancho, New Mexico. Please keep Sister in your prayers.

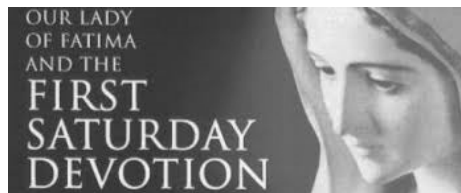
