My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we focus on the ministry of Jesus, we see that the heart of Jesus could never resist a hand outstretched in need or an appeal for help made in faith. Healing was at the center of our Lord's public ministry and a point worthy of note is that His healing activity extended to both body and soul. During His lifetime, Jesus went around all over Galilee curing whatever illness or infirmity was among the people and filled them with the life-giving presence of God. The healing acts of Jesus were a message that He had come to set people free.

In every generation, the mission of the church continues the healing work which Jesus began through His miracles. Every Christian is called to this ministry, one way or another. The unique healing power of Jesus was His willingness to show compassion. Nailed to the cross on the hill of Calvary, He forgave the good thief, even though He did not remove him from his agony of pain. There can be no doubt that his sins were forgiven and that he was spiritually healed. Real healing so often takes place in the simple and ordinary things of life that are so often neglected or taken for granted.

As children of God and brothers and sisters of the Lord, each one of us is called to represent God by Christ-like actions; no one can be excused from caring because our vocation *is* to be healers. If a friend of ours is terminally ill, medical knowledge and skill alone cannot make them well again. What they need, more than anything else in these situations, is that the love of God be made real for them through the actual concern shown by people around them. Just by being there, even though we are powerless, we can make the faith of God real for them because we are following the Lord in His compassion. The liturgy today reminds us of the generosity of Jesus, who became poor for our sake. We have received the richness of His many blessings and now we are asked to go out and share that same richness with others we meet.

Come July 1<sup>st</sup>, Fr. John will begin his new assignment; once again, as I said at his farewell gathering last week, our parish has truly been blest with his presence, the gift of his ministry and spirituality during his eight years of ministry here at Holy Family. There is a verse in the hymn called, "All I Ask of You," which says: "Persons come into the fiber of our lives, then their shadow fades and disappears." The words are profound and yet true because as Fr. John leaves for another ministry, his daily presence will be missed, however he has left a little bit of himself in each and every one of us. That is the special gift of stewardship which we all have; Fr. John's spirituality has touched us in many ways. We are fortunate that he is not too far away and so we will still see him as his schedule permits. Please pray for him as he adjusts to the challenges of his ministry. Again, I wish to thank all who helped in any way to make his farewell reception a success, the planning, setting up, cleaning up, was greatly appreciated. I'm not going to mention names for fear of forgetting someone, but thanks to all.

This coming Saturday is 4<sup>th</sup> of July; Fr. John, Fr. Mauro and I wish everyone a great holiday weekend. Please be safe if you are traveling.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church. The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.

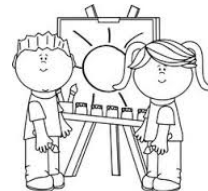
