BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

EMERGENCY CALLS: In case of an accident or sudden illness, call the rectory at any hour or reach us on the emergency phone, 973-715-3108. The priest on duty will return your call.

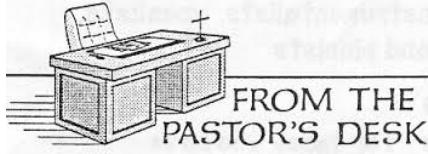

Body and Blood of Christ 2015 B

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we celebrate "**Corpus Christi**," *The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ*. The Church's proudest possession has always been the Eucharist, God's greatest gift to God's people. The Gospel today is a foundation document. From the beginning, Christians came together in private homes and relived the Last Supper. Holy Communion was brought to the sick people who could not attend. St. Justin, the martyr whose memorial we just celebrated on the 1st of June, describes this for us and he died in 165 AD. So the Mass



and Holy Communion are, in essence, as old as the Church herself. It was during this time that the custom developed of keeping hosts for Holy Communion somewhere safe so that they would be available to the priest or deacon in case of an emergency.

If you had gone to a Church in the tenth century, you would not have seen a tabernacle but, rather, a dove shaped container hanging over the altar. It was called a *Pyx*, and the Blessed Sacrament could be placed inside. Gradually people reflected on the meaning of this: THE PRESENCE OF JESUS. This is the body and blood of the risen and living Lord. He deserves our attention, our adoration, not only at the moment of communion but also whenever we come into the church. St. Thomas Aquinas, the greatest saint and scholar of the thirteenth century, wrote wonderful hymns of praise of the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, some of which we still sing today.

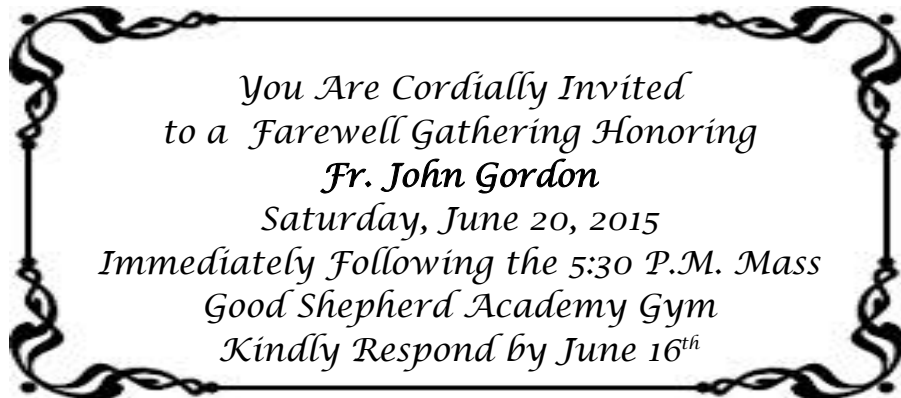
The custom of carrying the Blessed Sacrament in procession began for the veneration of believers and, in many places throughout the world including here at Holy Family, the custom continues. This tradition also occurs on Holy Thursday evening when we process with the Eucharist around the church to the Altar of Repose, but it is a sad occasion because we are reminded that on Holy Thursday, Jesus began His passion. Today we celebrate the full dimension of this glorious gift of the Eucharist during this Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed in a precious casing called a *monstrance*, children scatter rose petals and, in many countries, the faithful hang colored banners out of their windows while bands play as they honor the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

My brothers and sisters we must always remember that in the tabernacle of all churches, our Lord is alive and welcoming. The sanctuary lamp is always burning as a sign of that. Our Lord invited all of us to come and spend time with Him. The tabernacle is the face-to-face encounter and the face of the Lord is a challenging face but also a smiling face, an understanding face, and an encouraging face, as well as a forgiving face. Whenever we are in the presence of the Eucharist we can have a quiet, prolonged, and personal conversation with the Lord which is the heart of all prayer. Today is truly the day on which we can focus on the full beauty of this great gift which we are given. Our prayer should be that we may always feel the gentle presence of Jesus, drawing us like a magnet to His company.

Today we welcome our 8th grade graduating class at the 10:00 A.M. Baccalaureate Mass. We pray for them as they leave Good Shepherd Academy and go off to high school where they will meet new friends, face new challenges, and experience new beginnings in their education. May God bless them!

Last Sunday, I announced that Fr. John will be leaving us for a new assignment effective July 1, 2015. It is always difficult to say good bye but we give thanks to God for Fr. John's ministry among us. We will have a farewell gathering on Saturday, June 20, 2015, following the 5:30 PM Mass. Please respond to the invitation below.

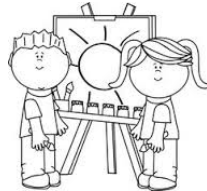
