





BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Upon reflecting on today's Gospel, we are moved, in a special way, as we see Jesus sending twelve ordinary men, after brief instruction, out into the world to preach the message of God's Word, which they themselves did not fully understand. He tells them that they are to have a simple lifestyle, to be poor as He was poor, and not worry too much about their physical needs, and they shouldn't be upset if their message was not welcome at every door. Their mission would prove to be successful. And the secret of this success was that these twelve men had benefitted from the living example of Jesus Himself during the time He spent in their company.

The sending of the twelve apostles was but the beginning of the church's mission in the world. Throughout the centuries, ordinary people have been called in the same way to win souls for Christ and to gather them into His church. If the word of God is to reach all people, then everyone who hears it must make it known. The message of the Good News of salvation is not intended to be guarded with jealousy but, rather, to be spread around and handed down. As baptized Christians we are all called to accomplish this work of spreading the gospel. The message of salvation is offered to all but not forced on anyone because it is a personal choice to accept or reject the call of God. Today we have the great privilege of responding to Christ's invitation to be fruitful bearers of His Good News. It can be challenging since we do live in a world where selfishness is part of the foundation structure. This invitation to a more dedicated life is indeed challenging and demands that we have a caring heart. Many of us are left with the feeling that we have nothing much to offer to the furthering of the Kingdom of God. One thing we can do is to provide a good example to children around us and show others that our faith is strong and alive in our hearts. Rearing our children in the faith and upholding Christian values in our homes is the good example we can give.

The Gospel today gives us the insight of being silent witness to a simple lifestyle. Many of us clutter our hearts and minds with worldly goods, which keep us from focusing on the priorities of life. So much of what we accumulate is left unused and wasted. We forget that the only luggage we can take with us when we leave the world is that of charity. We must remember that the work of Jesus demands total commitment in the small things we do in life with love and sincerity of heart.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



Many marriage customs stand in tension with modern American attitudes and values, notably "giving away the bride," which is no longer in the Catholic liturgy, and reminds us of a time when marriage was a contract between men (the groom and the bride's father). A Mexican custom, now approved for use in the United States, has a very different message.

An ancient Roman custom called for smashing pieces of gold and silver so that bride and groom could each keep half. This is the origin of today's Mexican practice of the groom giving thirteen gold coins to the bride, symbolically placing all his worldly goods into her care, and a sign of his unconditional trust. The coins are often given in beautiful gift boxes and are retained as an heirloom. Why thirteen? The standard explanation is that they represent Jesus and the apostles. The priest blesses the coins and pours them into the bride's cupped hands. Then she entrusts them to the groom, who later pours them back into her hands. This enduring ritual is in such harmony with our tradition's view of marriage that it is now increasingly performed by English-speaking Hispanic Catholics at weddings in the United States.



SENT BY GOD

In Amos' time the vocation of prophet had achieved a very formal status in Israel. The prophets had arisen, originally, to act as God's voice when Israel was no longer led by the spiritual/civil figures known as "judges," but by monarchs. Over time, the monarchy had appropriated the offices of priest and prophet, established them into companies, and reserved the right to appoint courtly prophets. Then, as now, when those in power also got to choose who would act as their official conscience, things sometimes went awry. At such times, God raised up prophets from unlikely places, and this is how Amos received his vocation as prophet. In last week's Gospel we heard how Jesus was raised up as God's anointed from a place many viewed as unlikely. As we continue to discern our own vocation as baptized disciples, we can be assured that we are, in Paul's words, "chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will" (Ephesians 1:11).
