BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!


Often times we find those moments, as did Elijah, when we say, “Lord, I’ve had enough.” When you think about it, our lives as Christians are by no means those of smooth sailing and we often find ourselves broken and crushed by the many challenging circumstances which come our way. Left to our own resources, we can find no light at the end of the tunnel and we just keep going. We look and seek assurance that we are not alone and that God is with us, helping us carry our crosses as well as rescuing us from any predicament that comes our way. The Gospel today points out that we have the help we need in Jesus who is the Bread of Life. He brings us just what we need to sustain us on our pilgrimage through life. Jesus is the heavenly bread, the medicine for the sick soul, the nourishment for a wounded spirit, as well as the light and strength for a weary mind and the source of new and eternal life, whose presence and power strengthens us. Jesus is the true living bread that has come down from heaven, the unique source of life.

Coming to Jesus requires more than a weekly walk up to the altar to receive Holy Communion. Jesus makes Himself available to us; we have to make ourselves present to Him. If we approach the altar complaining or with a heart full of bitterness because of the hurts which are inflicted upon us, then it is not a true sharing of the Eucharist. There is no way we can offer ourselves to God and not try to love our neighbor who has let us down in some way during the week. Our faith reminds us to be forgiving, to overcome faults, to understand failure of friends, and not to close our hearts when we are offended.

In the Eucharist we encounter the greatness of God who has forgiven us and who asks us, in return, to give as freely as we have received. The Eucharist is an opportunity of reconciliation as well as for old wounds and sores to be bound up and forgiveness to be shown. If we expect love from God, then we, too, must try to be loving also.

On another note; as many of you already know, this year I will be celebrating my 25th Anniversary in the Priesthood of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is hard to believe that the time has gone so quickly. I am beginning to plan for this special milestone in my life and would like to form a committee to help put this together. My actual date of Ordination was November 17, however, I have chosen Sunday, November 15, beginning with the noon Mass and followed with a celebration in Good Shepherd Academy. Ironically, I also celebrated my Priesthood reception here with the guidance of Msgr. Fimiani, a happy memory. Question: Is The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary a Holy Day of Obligation?



Answer: The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is a Holy Day of Obligation. However, when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is abrogated. For instance, the Feast of the Assumption falls on a Saturday this year, in 2015; in that case, Catholics in the United States are not **required** to attend Mass. However, the Mass which we will be celebrating on Friday evening at 7:00 P.M., for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata, will also be celebrated in honor of the Assumption for those who wish to attend. There is no special Mass on Saturday but, again, we will celebrate the Assumption at our 8:45 AM Special Remembrance Mass.

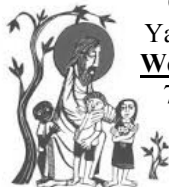
