



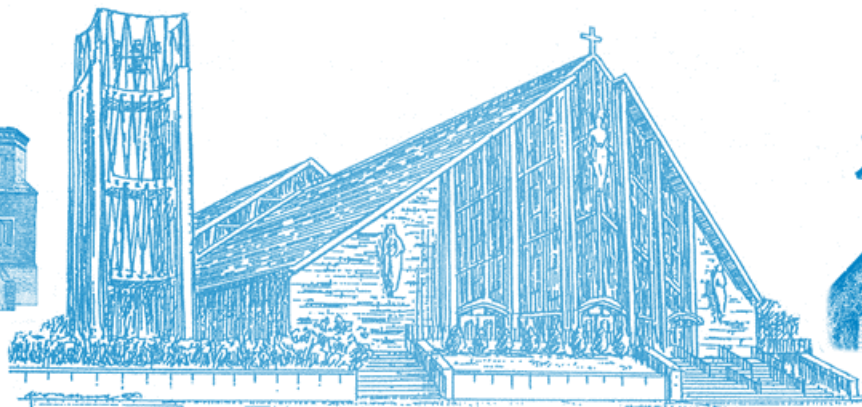

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

We welcome Bishop Serratelli at our 5:30 PM Mass this weekend and congratulate him as the recipient of the *Santa Maria Medal for Catholic Service and Leadership*. I am grateful to our Knights of Columbus Council 14712 for all their hard work in putting this Columbus Day dinner together. We welcome the Carabinieri from Italy as well as all of our guests at Mass and the dinner. It is always wonderful to have guests present in celebration of these special events in our parish. May God bless you always.

As we reflect on the Scriptures of this day, the bottom line of today's Gospel message is basically that we cannot buy our way into heaven. When you think about it, wealth mixes with worship of God as well as oil with water. We see how the rich young man prides himself on his goodness. He is the essence of respectability; he worships regularly and he observes the commandments. We can all agree that he has his act together and was assertive enough to come forward and ask Jesus the fundamental question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" We see that the answer he got was more than for what he had bargained. His big boast was that he had done nothing wrong in life but we see that Jesus is not at all impressed with this; Jesus was more interested in the use he had made of his life as well as the good he had done and whether he was prepared to go out of his way to help others. It is here that Jesus looked the young man straight in his eyes and invited him to sell everything he had and to come follow Him. We see here how the materialistic things in life dominate the young man and the peace he was seeking was far beyond his reach because his vision is limited to only his possessions. Unable to make the sacrifice, he departs from Jesus very saddened. Jesus does not see this young man as a model to be followed but rather, singles him out as a warning.

Being rich and having a lot of money may not be our problem but we are all invited to answer God's call to come and follow Him. Jesus asks us the same question: "Am I worth following?" He is not asking us to admire His way of life but rather to live it fully and not as part-time followers. Discipleship is always costly and being a follower of Jesus makes very stark demands on our life style. Our following Him means making the best use of our present situation and ultimately placing our lives in His hands. We only have one life and Jesus is inviting us to leave this world a better place for our presence than how we found it. This can only be achieved by helping others and not grasping everything for ourselves.

What is the Neo-Catechumenal Way?

Thank you to Fr. Joe for giving me the opportunity to write about the Neo-Catechumenal Way. I have been part of this experience since 1995 and it has been the most forming, rewarding and faith-building experience of my life. The Neo-Catechumenal Way is one of the fruits of the Second Vatican Council, aiming to foster a spiritual and liturgical renewal within our parish community. As Pope John Paul II stated, "I recognize the Neo-Catechumenal-Way as an itinerary of Catholic formation valid for our society and our times." *Pope John Paul II, Ogniqualvolta, August 30, 1990.*

In the primitive church, no one could be baptized without going through a *Catechumenate*. But beginning with the time of Christendom, in the Constantine Age (5th century and forward) since the Church opened the door to the masses of people, it was more difficult to instruct the people into the faith. Thus, the transmission of the faith was assumed and delegated to the family. In modern times, we can no longer presume that the family, faced with the challenges of modern culture, will be able to form their children in faith, thus, the need for a Baptismal Neo-Catechumenate, which will help us to rediscover the richness of our Baptism. Pope Paul VI stated, "The 'before' or 'after' the Baptism (of the Catechumenate) is secondary. I would say the fact is that you aim at the authenticity, fullness, coherence, and the sincerity of Christian life." (*Pope Paul VI audience 8/5/74*)

And aren't we all aware of the need for an adult faith formation in our life? When we stop to think of the reason of our believing, or when someone asks us why we practice our faith and why we believe what we believe, we find it difficult to give reason for our faith. Even more so, when we are hit by events that are difficult to understand (tragic events, death, sickness, the abandonment by one who is dear to us, all that we call *the crosses in our life*), we become puzzled about our faith and some even stray from their belief. The Neo-Catechumenal Way aims to build up in us such a deep relationship of faith with the Lord which will allow us to be confident in His Fatherhood for us, no matter what. It is an experience of eternal life already here on earth. It is important for each one to discover that God is our Father who provides for all our needs and always decides what is best for us. It is also important for us to discover that the Church is our Mother, who always feeds us with the best of the food, that being the Word of God and the bread from the Eucharist and accompanies us through our life journey. The question may arise but I have faith. Why do I need to begin an itinerary of faith? Indeed, the presence of a Christian community aims at giving the sign of faith to those who do not have faith, namely the "far away" or to those who have lost their faith, "the fallen Catholics." In our modern, secularized society, it is very difficult to be a Christian witness; therefore we need a stronger faith to face the current challenges.

The Neo-Catechumenal Way is a catechesis which lasts about six weeks, meeting twice a week. The Catechesis is imparted by a lay team, accompanied by a priest, and is centered on the Good News of the love of God (*Kerygma*), who takes the initiative to rescue all human beings from the slavery to sin to a new life in Christ. All one need to do is come and LISTEN, and you will experience the how good is the Lord.

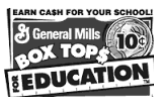
