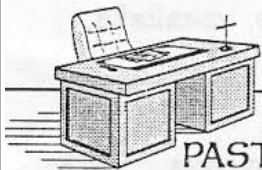

FROM THE
PASTOR'S DESK

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we reflect on the Scriptures today, we see that society, no matter what era of time, can ever get away from the problems posed by status and rank. It was no different in the time of Jesus. The old controversy about who was the greatest comes up once again among the apostles. This time James and John are requesting the favored treatment of Jesus; it was no small honor they were demanding while overlooking the suffering involved in Jesus' passion and death. With an eye towards the future, they were aiming at being part of Jesus' inner circle, by requesting that seat at His right and left hand in glory. But our Lord clearly spells out a new standard of greatness and status stating that the kingdom of God is not measured by worldly standards. And there is no room in His community for ambitious, power-hungry men who are power-motivated, solely by self-interest. Jesus wants His followers to think in terms of service rather than that of authority. Jesus lived what He preached His whole life - - from working as a carpenter in Nazareth to dying on the cross at Calvary - - setting the example of such service. At the Last Supper when He got up from the table and took the towel and basin and washed the feet of the apostles, He highlighted in dramatic form the importance of service. In doing so He was calling on His followers to share in the spreading of the Gospel by giving themselves completely to this new way of life.

My brothers and sisters, we serve God best by helping one another. As adults, we are all involved in exercising authority in some shape or form, whether at home or at places of work. There is no lording it over those in our care because authority is not for the controlling of people but for proper guidance of community. When Jesus warned His disciples not to set up worldly power structures within Christian communities, He was very much aware of our human failings. We are all inclined to be selfish and to live for ourselves without showing much concern for others. That attitude of "*what's in it for me?*" runs deep in all of our hearts. The standard of greatness is the standard of the cross and that's why we must never lose sight of the character of service.

I share some news with you; since July 23rd I have been preoccupied with my mother who suffered a fall in her yard. She had been doing her gardening, had her breakfast, and then tripped and fractured three ribs and had a compressed fracture in her lower back. These last weeks, she has been in much pain and discomfort. Due to her uncontrollable high blood pressure and asthma, pain meds were doing a number on her. Since she lives alone, my brother and I have been taking turns staying with her and making sure she is comfortable. Unfortunately, last week while in a CAT scan, it was noted that she had experienced a mild stroke. My mother, since last Thursday, has been in ICU then step down to the stroke unit. This past Tuesday she was to be released but continued to experience seizures and remained in the stroke unit. For this reason, I have not been visibly present during these past weeks. Please keep our family in your prayers mom appreciates the prayers that have been offered for her recovery.

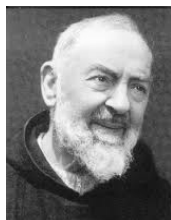
