



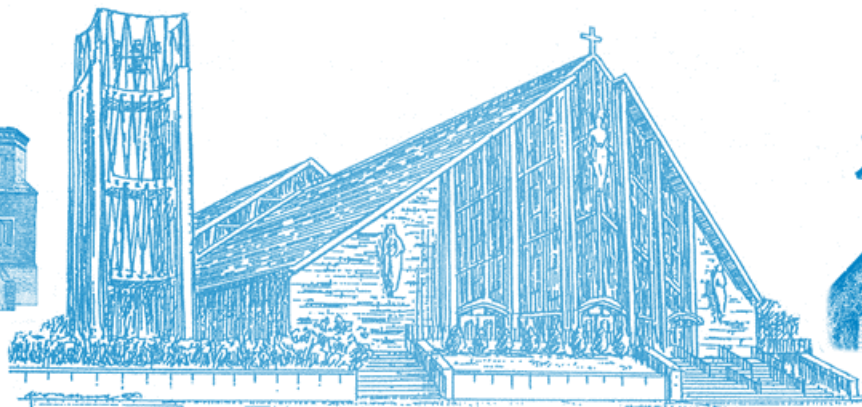

RECONCILIATION: Saturday, 1:00 PM

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The fact that we have eyes does not mean that we always see what is most important in life. There is more to sight than merely seeing the light of day. Eyes are of little use if we fail to see the hand of God at work in our lives. At times we all experience such darkness and are sorely in need of the light of God. In caring for the blind man Bartimaeus, Jesus is telling us that there is an even worse state of blindness than physical blindness. We all suffer from the spiritual blindness and Jesus is telling us that He can cure this illness and prevent us from groping around in darkness.

There are so many ways in which we can lack spiritual vision: hatred, pride, and jealousy can prevent us from seeing the goodness in our neighbors. Refusal to pay our debts or to do an honest week's work for wages we are collecting means that we are blinded to a sense of justice. Never having been satisfied with what we have and always wanting more material goods is an indication that we are blinded by greed. We are all victims of some sort of blindness but to become aware of it and to have the scales removed from our eyes, we must be continually searching and praying for more light. Only prayer and trust in Jesus, who is the light of the world, can dispel such darkness and restore our true spiritual vision. The closer we are to Jesus, the more light there is in our lives. The cry of the blind man today, "Lord that I may see," is a prayer that should always be on our lips.

Financial resources are essential to enable our parishes to continue supporting the journey of faith, spirituality and ministry of our expanding Catholic Community. As we embark on *We Are Living Stones* capital campaign, we look forward to the future, confident that all of our brothers and sisters in Christ will consider a sacrificial gift and join together to raise the important funds.

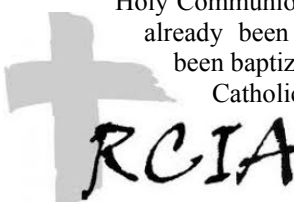
