**BAPTISM:** Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Last night we turned our clocks back and, in doing so, it has made the nights very long. As we enter this month of November we tend to look at it with a touch of despair; we see the falling leaves, dampness and fog, as well as seeing some frost on our cars in the early morning, and what lies ahead are the dismal winter days.

Traditionally, the church has associated the end of the year with the end of life. The festival of All Saints is meant to be a ray of sunshine at the beginning of these dark days. All Saints Day also brings to mind the ordinary people who, through the generations, were friends of God. Few of the them held important positions in lives and their names do not appear on the church's official role of honor. They are not canonized saints. God, alone, remembers them and the good works they have performed. They are the common people in all walks of life who, in their day, tried to live the Christian life to the fullest. Like us, they experienced the many challenges of growing up as well as the tensions of living with others and all the normal difficulties and uncertainties of life. They had to cope with their own personal problems and weaknesses. However great their difficulties and faults, they accepted that God loved them and they relied on the strength of that love more than anything else.

As we celebrate today's feast, it should give us the fresh courage to continue taking up our crosses each day in following Jesus. It also tells us that even now we must start living as children of God because Heaven is in our reach. It also reminds us that holiness of life is not for the privileged few but what God expects from all of us. We don't have to step outside the door of our home to start growing in holiness. Holiness is about bringing the spirit of Christ into our lives. Jesus commands us, "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect," and this is addressed to all of us. We are all called to reflect something of the holiness of God.

The saints are very close to Jesus. They are God's gift to His Church. The examples of their lives encourage us, and spur us on and keep us from settling for the mediocre or second rate. They are our friends in heaven and we should not hesitate to pray, through their intercession, so that something of their spirit may rest on us. We might remember also that all of us are *saints in the making* so we should be conscious of our dignity and high calling as Christians.

The Feast of All Saints Day also gives us a glimpse into our own glorious future, our eternal destiny which has to be worked out in love and service here on earth. As we honor today this vast company of God's friends, let us also pray and ask God's favor that where they are now we, too, may be in the future, and that one day we, too, may be included in this special feast.

Tomorrow we remember our beloved dead on All Souls' Day, most especially those who have gone home to the Lord this past year. Please join us for a special Mass of Remembrance at 7:00 PM tomorrow evening.

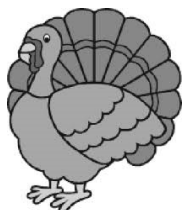
