



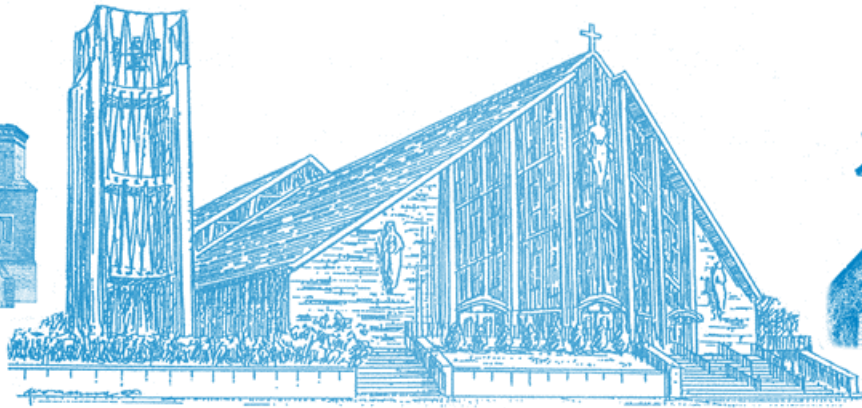

BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

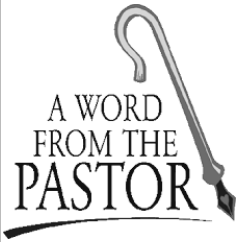

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time B-2015

My brothers and sisters in the Lord,

We have all heard the expression, “it’s the thought that counts,” or “it’s the self-giving of the gift which expresses love,” and this is exactly what Jesus is telling us in the story of the widow’s mite. What made her gift valuable and important is not the size but rather the heart and sacrifice behind it. In the eyes of the passerby, the widow’s offering is virtually worthless but, in the sight of God, it is most precious. After throwing her last two coins in the box, she is now able to say, “This is the best I can do because it is all that I have.” What wins her Jesus’ favor and earns His commendation is the fact that she keeps nothing back for herself. Her small gift is her all. And, in a way, she is making an offering of her total life to God.

This little incident outside the temple is worth telling because it draws our attention to the manner in which Jesus weighs us up and judges us. His searching eyes penetrate our souls and reveal the inner motives and hidden intentions behind our actions. He is concerned with the sacrifices we are making and how much of our lives are surrendered to Him and whether we are taking His demands seriously.

The hidden value of the widow’s offering teaches us that material goods are not the most important factors in the world. The issue being discussed in this gospel is discipleship that is generosity of spirit, not money, for all of us have something more precious than money to offer to God. What God is looking for, is our lives. He wants our hearts, not our possessions. So often, our giving or our contributions to worthy causes are conscience solvers. They amount to fulfilling of externals without indicating any real compassion of heart. We can all use them as an excuse to avoid personal involvement and dedicated involvement to the less fortunate in our area. What is hardest to give is ourselves in love and concern, because that costs more than reaching into our wallets. Learning to give generously to God is a difficult lesson to master and yet there is no true following of Jesus without such self-denial.

Today’s gospel story invites us to live in a way that hurts and does not count cost, because it is in giving that we receive. There is an immense gap between what we are and what we should be. The life-giving sacrifice of Jesus, who gave up everything for us on the cross, can inspire us to bridge that gap.

Safeguarding Children and Addressing Abuse - - The Archdiocese Acts to Protect Youth and Children

Archbishop Myers has stated categorically that the first responsibility of the Archdiocese is to protect children and young people and to provide healing and compassion to victims of abuse.

The Archdiocese of Newark requires all staff and volunteers working with children and youth to undergo background checks and receive sexual abuse awareness training. More than 20,000 Clergy, Religious and Lay people have received this training and undergone criminal background checks.

Nearly 95,000 children annually receive safe environment training through our Catholic schools and through opportunities offered to public school students in our religious education programs.

The Archdiocese makes use of the services of a Licensed Clinical Social Worker to be the first contact with individuals bringing allegations of abuse so that counseling and other support services can be extended immediately – even before a determination can be made regarding the validity of an allegation.

A full-time Office of Child and Youth Protection dedicated to supporting the work of protecting children works with parishes and schools to ensure that safe environments are in place throughout the Archdiocese
