**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

**Third Sunday in Ordinary Time C-2016**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

The message of today's Gospel, first preached in Galilee, is to be spread through us today. The Word of God, which first came to birth in our souls at the moment of our baptism, is anxiously waiting to burst forth and take root in the lives of others. Every year is a year of favor from the Lord. There are so many ways we can make these words of Jesus, about bringing glad tidings to the poor, liberty to the captives and sight to the blind, our very own and have them fulfilled in our hearing. When we help those whose hearts have grown cold and are heavily weighed down, the love of God shines through us and we make them realize that Jesus Christ is not a memory but is living among us today.



We can touch people's lives and be healers in times of estrangement. We can be sympathetic listeners in moments of sorrow and towers of strength and loving care during times of tragedy. To be successful channels of His message, we have to first put our own house in order, first by accepting the good news of Jesus, inviting Him into our lives so that He can show us the way. If we are privileged to receive the Gospel, then the challenge arises as to what extent we pass on this portrait of God's favor to others by what we are. A question for all of us to reflect upon is: *What is the Good News proclaimed by my life to others today?* There is nowhere we can walk in life without leaving an imprint of who we are, good or bad, upon the ground we walk on.

A great moment in Jewish religious history is recalled in today's Gospel. Jesus was at the center of attention when He declared the Lord's year of favor as He preached in the synagogue of His hometown in Nazareth, where He had been brought up. The hope of ages had been born in their midst. There was an air of expectancy at the realization that God, far from abandoning them, was truly near at hand, concerned and interested in their well-being. We must remember that God is always present in our lives, ready to comfort us as well as celebrate with us, as long as our hearts are open to His love and mercy.

Next weekend we begin Catholic Schools Week. Please plan some time to stop by and visit the Good Shepherd Academy Open House and see all the wonderful things that are happening there. We are blessed with 281 students and blessed with wonderful teachers under the direction of Sr. Jane Feltz, MPF. Please continue to pray for the success of all Catholic Schools
