My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

As we reflect on today's Gospel we might realize that, by human standards, the command Jesus made to Simon Peter, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch," was as foolish as Simon's acceptance of the instruction. Fish only come up to the surface for food at nighttime and they remain at the bottom of the sea during the day. We see that human experience was weighted against success so a decent catch would be highly unlikely. And, yet, something in Jesus must have struck a chord in Simon's heart which prompted him, against his better judgement, to obey Him. We see that outcome surpasses his wildest dreams. Peter's faith and perseverance were well rewarded when Jesus put him the way of this great catch. When Peter realizes what has happened, he is ashamed and overcome by the deep sense of his own unworthiness. And we see that he falls on his knees before the Lord, acknowledging his unworthiness and sinfulness.

What happened to Peter happens to us as well. When we recognize our own sinfulness, the power of Christ becomes available to enrich us so that we can offer ourselves to God, faults and all. The discovery of our spiritual poverty opens our souls to receive what God is offering us and awakens us to an awareness of His call. We should not be looking for God in strange places because He is present and speaking to us in the ordinary situations where He finds us: in the humdrum bits and pieces of our everyday lives. We are more likely to hear His call in the challenging moments of life rather than the easy moments. When we truly realize and discover the hand of God at work in our lives, it is then that the impossible becomes possible.

The challenge which we all face is to detect the voice of God in our lives and to have the courage and generosity to answer promptly. God expects us to share in His work of spreading His LOVE and MERCY. And Peter offers us an inspiring example in leaving his nets to become a fisher of men. Up to this time he was engrossed in his own work. Going out into deep water meant putting his faith and trust in Jesus to lead and guide into a new pathway in life. Jesus wants us to go through life with our hand in His hand. There will be times when we need to take new direction and face the unknown. Our response should be no less generous than Peter's if we are to meet the challenge of the vocation to which we are called.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2016 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 14, 2016, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 22, 2016.**

**Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

ASH WEDNESDAY, February 10: Ashes will be distributed **during** Masses and services, **all in the Church.** Masses at 7:00 & 8:45 A.M., 12:00 Noon, and 7:00 P.M. (bi-lingual) - Service Only at 4:00 P.M.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: In the Chapel on Fridays at 2:00 P.M., (except First Friday, March 4); and in the Church at 6:45 P.M. (Italian); 7:45 P.M. (English), every Friday during Lent.

On Good Friday, March 25, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

RECONCILIATION: Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, March 26, which is Holy Saturday); 7:00 - 8:00 PM each Friday during Lent. All Confessions will be heard in Church.

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST:

On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Holy Hour Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.

First Friday, March 4, Exposition at 6:00 P.M. with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M. Morning Prayer & Benediction.

On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross. Those dates are: February 19 and March 18. If you had an intention at either of those Masses, the intention will be announced the following day at the 8:45 AM Special Remembrance Mass. We apologize for any inconvenience. The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, March 13, 2016.
