BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

First Sunday in Lent C 2016



My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

As we begin the Lenten journey this week, the Church places us before an open doorway and invites us to embark on a journey of spiritual growth. Like Jesus in the wilderness, we are being led by the Spirit into a forty day period of prayer and fasting to help us reflect on the direction our lives are taking. It is an honest and frank attempt by the Church to make us come to terms with the harsh reality of the hard road to salvation.

In the desert, Jesus is confronted by the forces of evil on three separate occasions and is subjected to severe temptations in the depth of His soul. The devil meets Him face to face and, in an effort to turn Him away from God's plan of redemption, he offers Him false enticements of security, power and fame. However, none of these temptations got the better of Him and Jesus emerges victorious but only after a prolonged struggle. Temptation is a real test and the worst thing about it is that it is always an attraction. When tired and hungry, it would have been so easy for Jesus to turn stones into bread but He refused to use His power for His own comfort and allow His feelings to influence His actions. Those temptations which Jesus experienced are faced by all of us. They are a testing of our faith as they force us to make decisions for or against God. As followers of Christ, we must be ready to stand and be counted as we are constantly at risk from the evil one. And it is because Jesus Himself experienced temptation that He understands us in our weaknesses and is there to give us hope and encouragement.

Lent is a time for us to get back to the basics and to replenish the soil in which our Christian faith grows by curbing our selfishness and our pride. We are all pampered by creature comforts and we fall into the trap of thinking that material things will bring happiness, so we spend time having our wants and wishes satisfied. But the truth is otherwise, instead of helping us on the road to heaven, so often they turn out to be false escapes that lead us to unhappiness and frustration, which can raise us up for a great let down. All of us experience these tendencies within ourselves, but the Gospel states that there is more to life than the satisfactions of our appetites.

In the desert, our Lord turned His back on all that stood in the way of doing His Father's will. Lent is a time of quiet and purposeful reflection which helps us to discover the will of God. The fasting and self-denial, backed up by prayer and alms-giving, keep us growing in friendship with God. Let us make this Lent a time for beginning all over again by renewing our trust in Jesus who was tempted and triumphed over the evil one. The prayer on our lips should always be, "Be with me Lord, when I am in trouble."

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION CLOTHES NEEDED

The Archdiocese of Newark will be organizing their third annual collection of gently used and new communion outfits. First Communion is usually celebrated when children are between the ages of seven and eight. It marks the first day on which a child is admitted to receive the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, the sacrament that unites us to Christ throughout our lives. A child's First Communion is a special day for any family and the Archdiocese of Newark is trying to make sure financial hardship does not stand in the way of it being as special as it can be.



The Office of Development and Stewardship will be collecting gently used, in good condition, Communion dresses/veils, suits and shoes for our inner city parishes, the Religious Sisters at the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart who know families in need, and any parishioner in need of one for their child. Last year over 400 dresses and 200 suits were distributed.

All items can be dropped off at the Archdiocesan Center, 171 Clifton Avenue, Newark, NJ beginning Monday, February 22 through Friday, March 25 between the hours of 8:45 AM and 4:00 PM. We will distribute the outfits in April. Please make sure all outfits are free of stains and clean.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK - 2016 LENTEN REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (or Holy Saturday night) as the “paschal fast” to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, **and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.**

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially,” or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 14, 2016, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 22, 2016.**

***Canon 920, §1.** *All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.*

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: In the Chapel on Fridays at 2:00 P.M., (except First Friday, March 4); and in the Church at 6:45 P.M. (Italian); 7:45 P.M. (English), every Friday during Lent.

On Good Friday, March 25, the Youth Group will present the Living Stations of the Cross.

RECONCILIATION: Saturdays at 1:00 - 2:00 P.M. (except Saturday, March 26, which is Holy Saturday); 7:00 - 8:00 PM each Friday during Lent. All Confessions will be heard in Church.

LENTEN DAILY MASSES: There are 2 daily Masses during Lent: Monday-Friday, 7:00 A.M. in the Chapel; Monday-Saturday, 8:45 A.M. in the Church. Mass will also be celebrated at 5:30 on Wednesday evenings in the Chapel.

EXPOSITION OF THE EUCHARIST:

On Mondays at 7:00 PM, **Novena in honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and St. Jude** continues with **Holy Hour Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** and the Rosary.

First Friday, March 4, Exposition at 6:00 P.M. with Nocturnal Adoration, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus until 8:00 A.M. Morning Prayer & Benediction.

On Wednesday evenings, 4:30 - 5:30, Mass immediately follows.

MARIA SS ADDOLORATA MASS

During Lent, there will be no Mass for the Devotees of Maria SS. Addolorata on the third Friday of the month because of conflict with Stations of the Cross. Those dates are: February 19 and March 18. If you had an intention at either of those Masses, the intention will be announced the following day at the 8:45 AM Special Remembrance Mass. We apologize for any inconvenience.

The annual Mass honoring the apparition of Our Lady of Sorrows in Castelpetroso on March 22, 1888, will be celebrated at a 2:00 P.M. Italian Mass on Sunday, March 13, 2016.

FASTING & ALMSGIVING: Operation Rice Bowls, which are available in the Church vestibule, help to support Catholic Relief Services care for the poor in developing countries. Please use the calendar and eat a *simpler* meal each week (fasting) and place your sacrifice (alms), the money you save in terms of eating a simpler meal, and return your sacrifice in the envelope provided on Palm Sunday, March 20th. “Let us eat simply so that others may simply eat.”

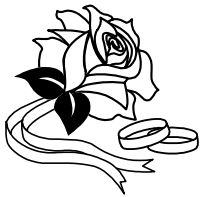
