



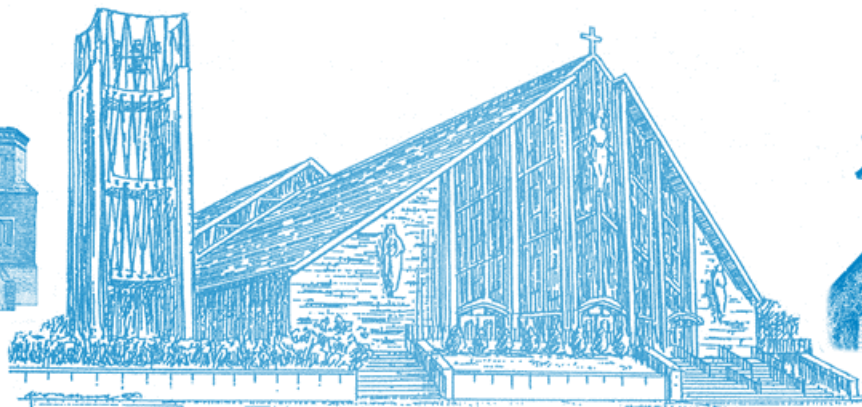

**BAPTISM:** Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

*Fifth Sunday in Lent C - 2016*

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

During the Lenten Season, we are forcefully reminded of the readiness of God to forgive sin, to bind up broken lives and to restore people to His friendship. The Church wants us to focus our attention on the plight of the sinful women because, before God, all of us stand silence in our sinfulness. The good news is that what Jesus does for her, He is also willing to do for us. Her story of sin committed and sin forgiven is not an isolated event but, rather, an example of the inexhaustible mercy and compassion shown by Jesus to sinners. When we express sorrow for our sins, Jesus also says to us: "Neither will I condemn you, go and sin no more." The lesson is not that sin is unimportant but that God, in His goodness, extends pardon to the sinner. Nothing is equal to the mercy of God as shown to us in our Lord Jesus Christ, who took the weight of our sins upon Himself when He gave His life for us on Calvary. Lent is an invitation to take a close look at our lives, acknowledge our weaknesses and start anew in the friendship of God our Father.

Jesus' offer of forgiveness and compassion to this publicly humiliated woman points out our call to be a forgiving people, dedicated to reconciliation. In many ways, we are as self-righteous as the Scribes and Pharisees. There are many times when we are only too ready to spread scandal with a bit of spicy gossip. Doesn't the tone of our conversation about an unmarried mother, the alcoholic and the shoplifter amount to looking down on them and passing judgment? It is so easy to criticize and condemn others yet, when our own faults are revealed, we need the welcoming and merciful hands of God. We should be overjoyed that, on the last day, God will be our judge and not our neighbor.

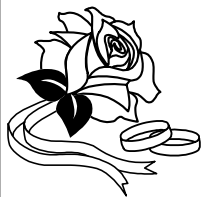
