BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

***THIS IS THE DAY THE LORD HAS MADE,
LET US REJOICE AND BE GLAD
ALLELUIA! ALLELUIA!***

As we reflect on this, the most glorious day of our faith, there is no day to compare with Easter Day. It stands out from the conflicts and turmoil of our broken world; it lifts our minds and enlivens our hearts with a joy and love so complete that it conquers death. Early on that Easter morning, a mighty act of God took place. Our Lord, Jesus Christ rose from the dead, He altered the past and shaped the future. And so, nothing can be the same again. That is what makes Easter the

greatest occasion of the year and the Good News to be shared for all time. All of our hopes and happiness stem from this great event. Easter announces that there is a way forward out of darkness, that transformation is possible and change can take place in our lives.

The resurrection of Jesus from the dead affirms that death is not the end of us. We are meant for more than this present life and are not anchored to this world. Human life is no longer limited by the cycle of birth to death. Easter is the answer to all the tears that we shed at the graves of our loved ones because it reminds us that we have a future greater than we dare to believe in, provided we open our hearts to the grace that Jesus won for us. Jesus has shared the gift of His life with us and His resurrection from the dead points to the resurrection of all people.

Easter is the turning point inviting us to live in an entirely new way that goes beyond the limitations of this world. We are challenged to become part of the new creation, inspired by the life of God, which is poured into our souls at the moment of our baptism. Life depends on how we look at it. It can be seen as an empty tomb full of bitterness and confusion or full of joy and hope. The challenge is to appreciate God and to see His plan in the ordinary events which surround us. We can only do this if we are faithful to our baptismal promises and tuned into Jesus and switched on to His power in our lives. He will help us find the face of God in the bits and pieces of life as well as in the hearts of all we meet.

The Gospel of this day tells us that on that first Easter morning, the stone at the entrance of the tomb of Christ was rolled back. The question we must all face is: have we arisen to new life with Christ or are there boulders weighing us down and keeping us imprisoned in our tombs? The Good News is that by God's power, those boulders which hold us locked and buried can be rolled back and we can be set free. We must never forget that God is in charge. It is His world and it is He who has breathed eternity into our very bones. The best way we can give thanks to God for the gift of His life within us this Easter Day, is by opening our hearts to the Risen Jesus and by allowing ourselves to be sent out into the world to proclaim the Good News of the love of Jesus.

I take this opportunity to thank all who donated Easter flowers in memory of loved ones and in honor of our Risen Lord in order to decorate our beautiful Church. Many thanks to all who helped decorate during these three days of the Triduum. May God bless you for your continued love and generosity for our parish.

A special reminder as we enter this Easter Season, please join us for our Parish Mission which begins next weekend. Our Retreat Master, Father Raphalle Bonnano from the Franciscan Ministry of the Word, will preach at all the weekend Masses on April 2 and 3. The mission will begin Monday, April 4 and go through Wednesday, April 6, beginning each evening at 7:00 PM. Please invite family and friends to join us, most especially, if they have been away from Church.

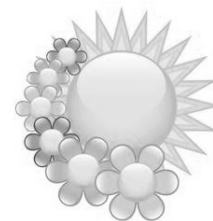

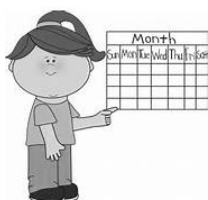
