BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today's Gospel story speaks of the merciful father and his two self-centered sons. It is one of the best loved stories found in the Scriptures. The life of the younger son tells us something about greed and all of its consequences but it also teaches us about the virtue of humility and repentance. We find the older son to be a complainer, which speaks a lot about human nature and how envy, jealousy and resentment come about when other people are treated well. We see the younger son in a hurry to meet life, getting what he can from his father and gathering his possessions, doing his own thing. When his money runs out, his friends disappear and he finds himself reduced to living like an animal. He finally comes to his senses and realizes he has made a fool of himself. He heads back home, hoping for forgiveness from his father. He is overwhelmed by the welcome and love his father offers him. The older son is a solid citizen and faithful to his father. He has never done anything wrong in his life and is resentful of his brother's notorious life style. He cannot come to terms with the easy pardon of his father nor join in the celebration. He could never have experienced the shame of returning home in disgrace, knowing that there would be so much gossip in town.

The true star of this story is the father who welcomes his son without a word of criticism. He could not change the basic fact that his son was still his son and will always be received with open arms. The father in the story is someone whose love never changes and is present all the time, as much as when his son goes off as when he returns. It's here that this Gospel passage tells us of the gracious goodness of God, His warmth with sinners and the length of His merciful arm. God never changes. In a way beyond our understanding, God knows the weakness as well as the perversity of the human heart, and makes allowances. His love for us remains and He is always willing to forgive.

This Lenten Season is a time for growing in an appreciation of the beautiful and comforting truth that every person has a place in the heart of God. The story is drawn from real life and, if we are honest with ourselves, we can see the shades of the elder and younger sons in ourselves. We tend to hold grudges and are unwilling to forgive one another. We forget our ever-loving Father who, even after our most stupid mistakes and tragic sins, is always ready to welcome us with open arms. The Gospel tells us what coming home to God is really like. This season of Lent is the time to open our hearts for the special gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Things to do for the Jubilee Year

The Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy are central to this Holy Year: "It is my burning desire, that during this Jubilee, Christian People may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy."

Focus on Lent. "The season of Lent during this Jubilee year should be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy.

"The practice of pilgrimage has a special place for the Holy Year" In addition to the Holy Door in St. Peter's Rome, Pope Francis has mandated that every Cathedral have a Holy Door.

"Let us place the Sacrament of Reconciliation at the center once more in such a way that it will enable people to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with his own hands."

A Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament: I ask that a holy hour of adoration be introduced on a regular basis at a convenient time. Prayers, readings and an appropriate amount of time for silence should all focus on God's mercy.

A Call to Action. "In this Holy Year, we look forward to the experience of opening our hearts to those living on the outer most fringes of society; fringes which modern society itself creates." Social ministry is not an add-on to prayer, study and adoration. This is a year that leads us to be a community sensitive to the needs of those on the periphery.

As Pope Francis puts it, what we must do is accompany all who are on the periphery on the journey of life. There are the indigent in our parishes, the jobless, the ill, the homebound, refugees, and the lonely. This Jubilee of Mercy is a call to social action.

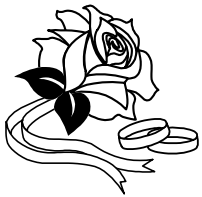
