**MARRIAGE:** Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

**ANOIDING OF THE SICK:** This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

**MINISTRY OF THE SICK:** The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

**VOCATION:** Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

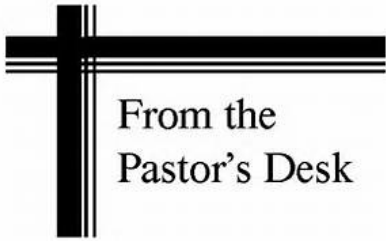

My brothers and sisters in the Lord;

Today we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. The picture painted in today's Gospel is a colorful description of the spectacular beginning of the new-born Church as an active missionary community. We see the Holy Spirit as a roaring wind which descends with tongues of fire upon the heads of the apostles and breathing new life into this scared group assembled in the Upper Room. The immediate impact on the apostles is radical and dramatic. Because of their faith and trust, they are inspired by the Holy Spirit to go out into the world and proclaim the resurrection of the Lord Jesus and His conquest of sin and death to those who had recently mocked, scorned and crucified their master. We see that they are no longer terrified and cowardly individuals locked away in the Upper Room for fear of the Jewish Community. Their world, which had fallen apart with the crucifixion and death of Jesus, was changed and transformed into a new creation. They come out full of enthusiasm and are gifted with eloquence as well as very clear sense of their vocation.

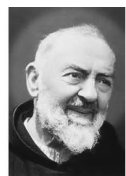
The thought of all this makes us realize that the first Pentecost must have been an exciting time to be alive in the Church. The atmosphere must have been joyful, the change was in the air and the outpouring of God's love was all over. However, the coming of the Holy Spirit is not something that happened only at the foundation of the Church; it is the living breath of God that is at work all the time as a permanent feature, renewing and building up the body of the Church. The gift of the Holy Spirit, given at Pentecost, is available to our community of worship here at Holy Family provided we are open and willing to receive it. The Holy Spirit acts through humans but depends on our response to His promptings. If we are prepared to live our lives according to the guidance and inspiration of the Holy Spirit by always doing what we sincerely believe is right, there will be no limit to the support which He will give us.

Today's celebration of the birthday of the Church is an excellent opportunity for evaluating the use we are making of our God-given talents. The Church is built up when we use our special gifts or talents, not for our own benefit but for the good of all. We are all laborers whom the Lord asks to go into the harvest. How we love and care for each other is a message to everyone we meet and also on that which outsiders judge our Christian faith. The fact that our gifts are not of the spectacular type which fascinated the onlookers at that first Pentecost, does not diminish their importance. Being a patient father, a loving mother, a good listener, a forgiving person, and having time for the elderly, may not attract the headlines of a newspaper but it witnesses to the fact that God is to be found in the humdrum of everyday life.

We must remember that it is the ordinary things which we share most fully, that are the greatest of Gods gifts. As we face the difficulties and challenges of life, we should rejoice and celebrate the fact that the Holy Spirit is always present, enlightening our mind with hope and gradually forming Christ in us as He did in the womb of our Blessed Mother. The words, "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love," should joyfully resound from our heart.

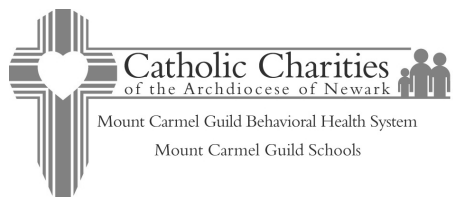
