BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

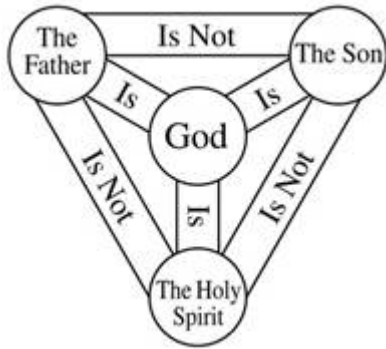

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

The feast of the Holy Trinity is a celebration of the mystery of God. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross, the words which accompany this holy action, “In the Name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit,” remind us that there are three persons in God. We have not been left in the dark in our struggle to attempt to understand God because from what Jesus said and did during His life time on earth, we can grasp the little pieces of the innermost mystery of God. Throughout His entire life, Jesus constantly spoke about God as His Father and He referred to Himself as God’s only Son. He continued by also explaining that His mission was to do God’s will. Jesus then introduces us to the Spirit, whom He talks about as being a real person, completely different from Himself and God the Father. The job of the Holy Spirit is to inspire people to continue in the Church the work begun by Jesus as well as to draw everyone into the love of God the Father.

Today’s feast is a reminder of a simple truth which we often forget; it is God’s plan that we share in His life of glory. Through the gift of our baptism, we are raised to the level at which we become sharers in the family life of God. We are born of God the Father, God the Son becomes our brother, and the love of God is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. The revelation of His inner life of Three Persons, in which we have a share, is one of God’s greatest gifts to us and it is the model towards which all of us should aim and strive.

Our Lord reveals the mystery of the Trinity to us, not just to let us know about the truth about God, but also to know about the truth of ourselves, as to what is our origin, where is our destiny and how can we arrive at that final point. We need to remember that we only exist and the world only exists, because God gives life. He is the Father who looks upon us as His children and is closer to us than we are to ourselves. We must also remember that every day is a day to love the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, so we should strive to make the Holy Trinity a more practical part of our lives. Love is the binding force of the Three Persons of the Trinity, so when we love, we share in that community of love which is the living God.

This celebration today of the abundance of God’s love is an occasion for us to appreciate what God has done and continues to do for us. It calls us to respond to the love of God, poured into our hearts by Christ and the Holy Spirit, and invites us to look forward to the day when we shall share in the glory of God – the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

JOURNEY OF FAITH

We are on a long and eventful journey. Today’s readings for Trinity Sunday succinctly cover the depth and breadth of our human travels.

The very beginnings of our journey are revealed in the reading from Proverbs. God’s plan filled with divine wisdom was born before the earth was made. In today’s Gospel, Jesus speaks of His own personal journey. He has come from the Father and will return to the Father. Only then will the Advocate—the Spirit of Truth—take us onward.

This does not diminish the fact that the journey will be hard. The very setting of the Gospel is the night before Jesus died. As Saint Paul writes to the Romans, “[W]e even boast of our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, and endurance, proven character, and proven character,

hope” (Romans 5:3-4).

Ultimately, our human journey is modeled by the Holy Trinity—a family of love among Father, Son, and Spirit that we are all called to emulate.
