BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. It was instituted to focus special attention on the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In a sense, it is a repeat of Holy Thursday's Mass of the Last Supper. The sad memories associated with Holy Week tend to overshadow the Lord's breaking of bread and His farewell promise that He would be with His church all days until the end of time. It is a celebration of the generosity of the Lord to us, in offering Himself

as food to satisfy our spiritual and material hunger as we journey through the many challenges of life. On this day, the church makes us sit down to stop and reflect on the great miracle of God's real presence among us. We thank the Father for the gift of His only Son as our Redeemer and Savior, as our Lord and friend. God has given us everything He could in the life of His Son.

This feast today is not only about the Eucharist but it is also about the community that assembles to celebrate the Eucharist. Hospitality is at the heart of the Gospel message. If our hearts are not open and ready to share with those in need in our ordinary life, we cannot be united in our celebration. There is no way we can offer the Eucharist and not reach out to the poor as Jesus did. It is the daily life that we live during the week that gives us something to bring to the community Mass on Sunday. We cannot take a worldly life style to the altar and celebrate it as Christians. By living lives of service for others, we begin to appreciate what the Eucharist is all about. It sends us out to touch the lives of our neighbors as the healing presence of a helping hand or a sympathetic ear, as well as changing despair into hope and suspicion into trust.

One cannot be truly present at the Eucharist without a desire to change and set out on the road traveled by Jesus, and trying to live the life He did in a caring and sharing way. Every celebration is an invitation to give ourselves to His power of love, which will change us and bring us to eternal life. When we are deeply scarred by sin the Eucharist binds our wounds, restores our strength and pours out peace into our troubled souls. The very fact that we celebrate this feast indicates that we are a people of thanksgiving, a community which knows how to praise God for the basic gifts of life, family, friends, food and clothing. Above all, we thank God because of what He has done for us in Christ.

Dear Friends,

In light of the recent announcement, I have asked Fr. Joe for the opportunity to share some thoughts with you through this bulletin.

First of all, please accept my most heartfelt gratitude and thanks for allowing me, over the past 18 years, to share with all of you moments of great joy, of overwhelming memory-making and even of tremendous pain and sorrow. By permitting me to share your lives, you have enriched me and allowed me to grow in ways I could not even imagine when I arrived here on July 7, 1998.

In the past few days, so many thoughts have raced through my mind. From the welcomes offered that first day by parishioners like Alicia Bennett and the now, "Father" Carmine Rizzi, you have always made me and those I love beyond the borders of Nutley, feel that this parish is, indeed, a "Holy Family."

You have been, and will always continue to be, a part of my heart, a part that has made me the Sister Eileen you have come to know.

The Lord is asking all of us, Father Joe Ferraro, me and all of you, something we do not understand or that we even find acceptable, but that there is our God who knows what is best. We must trust God and believe, as I have all my life, that He holds us in the palm of His hand and will not let go.

As this story unfolds, you will be kept informed. Just keep me in your prayers.

Fifty-six years ago, when I entered the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Chestnut Hill, the Sister who was my sponsor told me to keep the following prayer close to my heart. I share it with you now.
