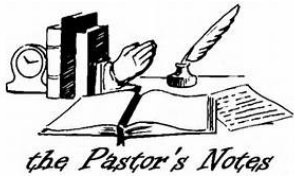

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

In today's Gospel we see the redeeming, transforming power of the love of Jesus. It was not for an important person but rather for a woman who was despised and cast out by a respectable society. Yet Jesus understood and welcomed her and, by doing so, He transformed her into someone of great worth.

Simon, the Pharisee, had invited Jesus to dine with him. Even though he respectfully referred to Jesus as *Rabbi*, he had not received Him with a kiss, nor washed His feet, nor anointed His head with oils, as was customary. All these actions would have signified warmth of friendship, but they were not given. During the time of Jesus, those invited into a home left their sandals at the door as they entered and rested on low couches with their feet behind them. Visitors entered and left through the open door; often times, beggars arrived hoping for crumbs of food. And so we have the woman in today's story that could have entered without being questioned or turned away. She came in from the street and her tears did what Simon failed to do, that is, wash the dust off of the feet of Jesus. We see her in a spontaneous gesture against all custom; she let down her hair and wiped away the tears, she anoints with oil not His head but rather His feet and, with great humility, kissed them. Jesus could see the reaction of the Pharisee, see his face and read his thoughts as well. It is here that Jesus asks the question in a parable, confronting His listeners with the truth about love and forgiveness, the move is love which is both given and received.

The fearless love which this woman exhibits overrides all other considerations. She thinks for no one other than this compassionate man who has given her back her own self-esteem. He tells her, "Your sins are forgiven," and continues by saying that that her faith has made her whole and to go in peace. In letting this woman touch Him, and in upholding in her in what she did, Jesus entered the public scorn with her. Through her love for Him, He let her enter His love and, in respecting her, He gave her back her own self-respect. My brothers and sisters, we live in a world where we make judgments that dictate our actions. We categorize and label and we seem to see individuals and what they have to offer. It is so easy to blame others for their misfortunes, for in doing so we allow ourselves to escape from the responsibility of acting on their behalf. But if we can remember that we are loved and forgiven and infinitely valued, then we, in turn, can offer love and forgiveness to those in our world who need it.

**Sharing God's Blessings Annual Appeal 2016**

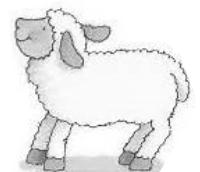

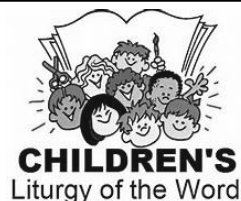

**Love Can Make The "Unwanted Child" Wanted!**

"One hundred fifty years ago, President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation declaring that slaves held in Confederate territory were free men and women. One hundred fifty years later, children in every part of the country still face the degradation and hopelessness of the practice President Lincoln sought to end...For the last 40 years and even earlier in some states, many of our judges and lawmakers have treated people like property. They've held babies in the womb to be like chattel, possessions to be discarded or destroyed, with their mothers cast as owners. These officials, along with the abortion industry itself, feign ignorance of the unborn child's humanity...We can't stop all evil in this fallen world, but we can fight it in our own neck of the woods with love. Love never ends. Love can save lives.

Love declares that there is no such thing as an unwanted child...With love, children are adopted, not aborted. With love, children are cherished, not abused. With love, there is less room for the oppressor because his hunting grounds are smaller...We simply need to see no child as unwanted...And it can start with just one. **HOPE AND FORGIVENESS**

There were some interesting conceptions of sin prevalent in the time of the Hebrew scriptures. There was the belief that God punished sin immediately. Those who suffered disease or misfortune were, therefore, sinners getting their due from the Almighty.

Today's first reading hints at another kind of God. When David admits his sin, Nathan declares, "The LORD on his part has forgiven your sin" (2 Samuel 12:13b). Here was not a vengeful God but a merciful God. What good news that must have been to David and those who, like him, could be honest enough to admit their sinfulness!

Jesus is the good news of God's mercy and forgiveness incarnate. Without Jesus, perhaps the good news would have been too good to believe, too difficult to imagine. But there he is in today's Gospel, the God-man, forgiving a sinner and declaring that she is forgiven because of her great love.

There is hope, then, for the rest of us sinners, if only we love enough!
