**From the Pastor**

**13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time C-2016**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Our Gospel today speaks of discipleship and the cost involved in following the Lord. We see Jesus being refused entrance into a Samaritan village and James and John are so caught up in the heat of the moment that in their fury they want to destroy it totally. Jesus, however, isn't into the dramatic gestures or into the instant response; instead He calmly walks to the next village. We clearly see the work of *common sense*.

Saint Luke introduces various would-be disciples who show a lack of readiness. To the first he points out the hardships that any disciple might have to face including no security or place to call your own. To the next one, who wishes to discharge his sacred family responsibilities, Jesus starkly warns that being a disciple means placing God's kingdom before all other calls and commitments. To the third, who is still attached to his family, Jesus warns of the absolute primacy of His call above all other relationships. He says that nothing, not even natural affections, can come between the true disciple and his master. The implied message in all these examples seems to be not to act on impulse. Don't choose rashly; think seriously before you decide to be a follower of Christ because it involves hardship, commitment, self-sacrifice, courage, as well stamina. If you are half-hearted, if your loyalties are divided, if you don't think you can last the distance, then it is better not to begin the task at all.

We might ask ourselves where the good news is in this message. Maybe the key lies in the words of Saint Paul, "When Christ freed us, He meant us to remain free." The only true liberty lies in obedience to Christ, who is the Lord of Life. It is the freedom to serve others, as Paul tells us, the freedom to love your neighbor as yourself. To some, such a *law* would mean nothing more than a restriction, like a straightjacket to personal freedom. But to the Christian, true freedom lies not in personal ways but, rather, in perfect obedience to the one who calls us, who leads us, and who gives us eternal life.

Discipleship simply means following; following where someone else leads, where someone else has gone before. We follow a crucified Lord, one who set out for Jerusalem and the cross. The cross, the road to Jerusalem, is unavoidable in the life of every true disciple because there is no other way to find the freedom of the resurrection.

The Gospel also warns us to not be impetuous. Weigh up the cross of being the Lord's disciple. The question is if you are prepared to pay it. If the Lord leads you by difficult or painful paths, will you follow? If He asks you to follow in His time, not yours, will you respond? We should remember that Jesus is not in to dramatic gestures, He wants only our good, our freedom, and our happiness. He will surely lead us on to the path of life, the fullness of joy in God's presence. The question is, *are you ready to follow where he leads?*

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**



An old and still vital treasure in our tradition is a document called the "Apostolic Traditions," giving us a snapshot of church life in third-century Rome. Its author, Hippolytus, describes the liturgical life of the church and records the actual texts of the prayers. The way he explained the various "orders" of the church was the basis for a major reform of the rites of ordination by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and later for the Second Vatican Council. Hippolytus tells us that a bishop had to be elected by the entire people, and that ordination had to take place on a Sunday in the presence of the people, the presbyters, and neighboring bishops. The bishop-candidate is ordained by the other bishops, who impose their hands on his head while everyone else keeps a profound silence, awaiting the outpouring of the Spirit. There is a prayer of blessing said by one of them, on behalf of all, asking for the Spirit and describing his ministry.

Later centuries layered new features on top of this liturgy, including the requirement for three bishop consecrators. Today, whenever a new bishop is announced (election by the people is no more), a kind of genealogy is provided, tracing his pedigree through the consecrating bishops down through the centuries to Peter and the first body of believers. Every bishop today can trace his office through his consecrators back to the beginning in a tradition called "apostolic succession."

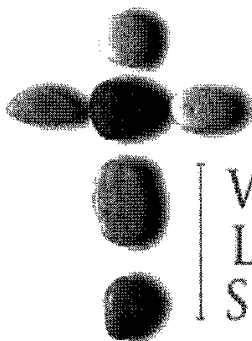
The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) is sponsoring the Fortnight for Freedom which highlights the need for religious liberty. The
