BAPTISM: Baptisms are scheduled once a month on Sunday afternoons except during Lent. Expectant parents are asked to contact the rectory to schedule an appointment at least three months before the desired date of Baptism. Parents must attend a special catechetical session prior to the Baptism.

MARRIAGE: Couples should contact the rectory one year in advance of the proposed wedding date in order to allow for the proper pre-marital preparation. At least one person must be a registered parishioner of Holy Family.

ANOIDING OF THE SICK: This is a sacrament not only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, we encourage you to call for a priest in the rectory.

MINISTRY OF THE SICK: The Eucharist will be brought to the homebound. Please contact the Rectory with the names and addresses of parishioners who are ill or homebound.

VOCATION: Women and men who feel called to the religious life, and men called to Holy Orders, should contact the Vocations Office at 973-497-4365.

My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

Today's readings give us a lot to reflect upon. They make us stop and think that if perhaps we never had the experience of losing a young child, we should just be silent in the face of these readings. And perhaps if we had never lost a child of any age, we should still remain silent. Yet Jesus stills us to reflect on the enormous loss to a mother or father of a child. This reflection can help us understand God Himself, sending us His own Son.

Our hearts are truly touched in the first reading from the Book of Kings. We find a mother who had longed to have a son and the prophet had promised that God would give her a son, but then the son dies. Our thought is *how cruel can God be? Or does death, even of a child, have some meaning that escapes us?*

The second reading is neither related to the first reading or to the Gospel, yet we can understand how the author of the letter to the Galatians wants us to know that God acts in His own mysterious ways and not in ways that we can easily understand. It is important to realize that whenever we face any huge suffering in our lives or in the lives of others, it remains a mystery us, God's mystery. Sometimes it is only in this deep faith in God that there is a meaning which can keep us on His path.

As we move on to the Gospel, we find the story of another mother whose only son, a young man, had died; and she was a widow. The loss of this only son means that she no longer has any protection, neither husband nor son. However, Jesus is there and restores life to the dead young man, the only son of his mother.

There are many times in life when some of us wished we had the power of God to restore a life to someone for the sake of his or her family or for the sake of those grieving, or maybe for the sake of bringing joy once more to those who are in sorrow. Yet we find ourselves powerless, asking God to please work that miracle that is needed. Both mothers in the Scriptures today found themselves without power. The mother in the First Book of Kings turns to a man of God to help her. The mother in the Gospel was grieving without knowing where to turn. As we reflect on our own lives we might question ourselves: *what do we do in the face of sorrow and suffering and where is our faith? Is our faith strong enough to seek that miracle and accept whatever comes from the hand of God?* Or do we just turn away from God and just become unbelievers? The message in today's readings is God inviting us to faith, to persevere no matter how challenging things might be.

I take this opportunity to, once again, thank all who helped to make Fr. Vincent's celebration last weekend such a success, may God bless all for their kindness. Please pray for Fr. Vincent and his class as they begin the challenges of their ministries.

We welcome two Seminarians, Marco and David. Marco comes to us from Sicily and David from California; both are in second year theology and will be spending the month of June with us before going home to their families. I know you will make them feel welcome. Please pray for them and for all vocations.

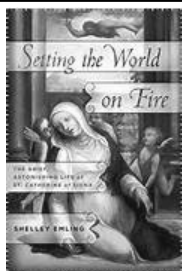
