My brothers and sisters in the Lord!

As we reflect on the Old and New Testaments, we see that *love* and *being neighborly* are linked together. The old law says: "Love the Lord your God," and "Love your neighbor as yourself." Our Lord put all of the commandments into just those two sentences.

Jesus tells the lawyer who tests Him, "This is what you must do to have eternal life." We see that the lawyer responds by asking, "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus' response is in a story and He gently, but firmly, makes the lawyer answer his own question. Jesus neither condemns nor attacks but His listeners must draw their own lessons from His words.

The road from Jericho to Jerusalem was the route to the temple and since service in the temple was on a rotating basis, both priests and their temple assistants, the Levites, would often make the journey.

Those who performed the priestly duties were strictly bound by rules that were considered to be God-given, the rules that safeguarded against defilement. If the rules were broken, they were unable to serve others in their temple duties. And among these clearly laid down rules found in the Book of Leviticus, is one forbidding any contact with a dead person. The lawyer knew all these regulations, he worked with rules and he would expect the priest to behave in the same way.

It is here that Jesus brings a Samaritan into the picture, a man from a despised people, one who himself would cause that defilement if even a drinking vessel of his were to be used. It is this man whose compassion leads him to save the traveler who otherwise, would have been left for dead. The man he saved could have been a Jew; and, in fact, he could have also been a journeying priest because Jesus said the man was walking on the road and He gives him no identity. But what we see is *the untouchable* touches with love and a man's life is saved.

The lawyer would have been aware of the endless rabbinical debates as to which classes of people were to be excluded from *the neighbors* that they were commanded to love as themselves. But in Jesus' message, there is no exclusion and the question is definitely not only *who is my neighbor* but *to whom and in what way am I a neighbor?*

Again, upon reflecting on this Gospel passage, unless the priest had touched the wounded man he would not be able to tell if he were dead or alive and, so rather than being contaminated, he chooses not to find out. We might ask ourselves if we even come close to doing this. If we hold on to the *them and us* mentality and chose to keep distances between us and them, we need not bind up any wounds or give any tangible expression to the compassion. We can plainly love the neighbors we want to love.

If they are not of our Church, they are less good; if not of our country, therefore less important; if not of our class, then somewhat different; if not of our accent, in some way, strangers. God made us. He loves us. But our question is always there, *how can He love them as He loves us?* They sleep in doorways, they take drugs, and they are unclean. Well then, they can't be our neighbors.

We need to reflect on where we stand and honestly ask ourselves, are we priest or lawyer or Samaritan, do the rules drive out compassion and, finally, who for us is our neighbor? All important questions to ponder if want to be true to our faith.

**Foreign Missions**

On March 25, 1904, Pope Pius X addressed an encyclical letter to the Catholic world recommending the Propagation of the Faith to the charity of all the faithful, in which he says: "If the messengers of the Catholic doctrine are able to reach out to the most distant lands, and the most barbarous peoples, it is to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith that credit must be given. Through that Society salvation began for numberless peoples ..., through it there has been gathered a harvest of souls ...." In 1884, His Eminence Cardinal Gibbons, writing to the directors of the society in the name of the American hierarchy assembled at Baltimore for the third national Council, said: "If the grain of mustard seed planted in the virgin soil of America has struck deep roots and grown into a gigantic tree, with branches stretching from the shores of the Atlantic ocean to the coasts of the Pacific, it is mainly to the assistance rendered by your admirable Society that we are indebted for this blessing."

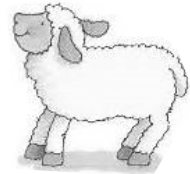
