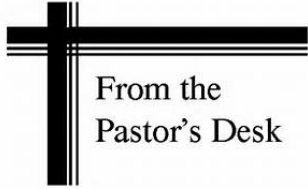

**From the
Pastor's Desk**

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

The story of Martha welcoming Jesus into her home has always been a popular one. The question might be whether the reason for the popularity of this story stems from St. Luke's original intention in writing it or whether a later interpretation has influenced our understanding of it, even to the point of corrupting the original text.

Medieval commentators saw the story as a comparison between the active and the contemplative Christian lives, a comparison which came down in favor of the contemplative modelled by Mary. Modern commentators think that this interpretation was more the result of medieval church concerns than the original point of the story. The words which bring out the contrast between Martha and Mary, "few are needed, indeed only one," show the greatest variance in the original manuscripts. So often they are not there at all and later they appear as an addition.

In looking at the context of the story, a different slant appears. Jesus has just told the parable of the Good Samaritan; a story offered in reply to the question, "Who is my neighbor?" It is from that story we learn that our neighbor is the one in need. Now we find Martha trying to respond to the need of Jesus: parable is translated into life. And one might wonder what is lacking in her act of welcome.

In the story of the Good Samaritan, we are told of the priest and the Levite who failed to recognize or react to the immediate need which faced them. Martha seems to be getting caught up in a similar trap but this time with the best of intentions. All of us agree that anyone who has given a dinner party will sympathize with her problem. Martha is so worried about the meal and getting everything perfect that she fails to be there with her guests. Mary, instead, forgets this rite. She is simply there for Jesus, listening to His voice, drinking in His words, being fed by Him.

It has often been pointed that if we were all like Mary, nothing would get or appear on the table. And this is quite true. But we also need to remember that this is Martha's story, not Mary's. As we are asked to be like the Good Samaritan, so are we asked to be like Martha and welcome Jesus into our homes, whether as Himself or as a stranger. But the question is how we keep our priorities straight and welcome Him than rather being distracted by trying to organize everything to express that welcome. When we welcome people to our homes, do we concentrate on their needs or do we get carried away by our desire to impress them or fear that we might not get it right in some way?

Many times when we are trying to spend time with the Lord in prayer, we get caught up in things that drag us down and prevent us from being sincere in our prayer. At Mass, do we really welcome the true presence of Jesus in Holy Communion or do our personal preferences take over? Are we listening to the words of the Scriptures?

Like Martha, in the cause of our discipleship, we all worry and fret too much at times. Like the Good Samaritan, we need to bring ourselves back to focusing simply on what is needed at each moment and then letting go.

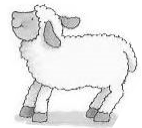

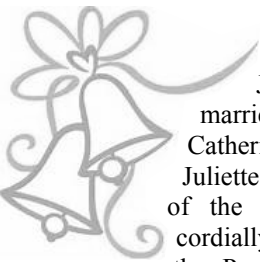
